> The second half would begin with a running clock as high school rules dictate when a team is ahead by 40 points.


> Estill's future stars saw the majority of the action in the second half. Even a couple of meaningless touchdowns in the final quarter could not outweigh the experience the youngsters gained.


#### **WORTH REPEATING**
