# IPD arrests more than 30 in drug bust

The warrant says that Harrison has failed to pay his fine of \$330.

Wallace "Frog" Crowe, 75, of 140 Henry White Road was indicted for trafficking in a controlled substance, second degree, and also first degree.

The indictment says that Crowe sold four hydrocodone to a confidential witness on August 9 and three morphine on August 10.

Larry D. Johnson Jr., 42, of 420 4th Street, Ravenna, was indicted for trafficking in a controlled substance, first degree, and trafficking in legend drugs.

According to the indictment, Johnson sold 1/2 an oxycodone to a confidential witness on July 25 and ten neurontin on July 25.

Bobby Welch, 60, of 529 Broadway, was indicted for one count of trafficking in a controlled substance, first degree, first offense. Welch's indictment says he sold one oxycodone to a confidential witness on July 24, 2014.

Maggie R. Puckett, 46, of 294 Turner Ave., Irvine was indicted for a single count of trafficking in a controlled substance first degree, first offense. The indictment says that Puckett sold four oxycodone to a confidential witness on July 11, 2014.

Belinda Rawlins, 23, of 300 Hensley Lane, Irvine was not indicted but was arrested on a citation for complicity to trafficking in a controlled substance, first degree, first offense.

The citation says that Rawlins assisted in drug trafficking at 294 Turner Avenue by sending buyers there to purchase drugs. Rawlins allegedly received 25% from the profits of drug sales, \$5-10.

Greg Neal, 33, of 264 Broadway, was indicted for trafficking in a controlled substance, both in the first and third degrees.

The indictment says that Neal sold one-half an oxycodone and five xanax to a confidential informant on August 21, 2014.

Nokoa Lee Crowe, 30, of 310 Third Street, Ravenna was indicted on a single charge of trafficking in a controlled substance, second degree, first offense.

The indictment says N. Crowe sold two suboxone to a confidential informant on July 23, 2014.

Bobby W. Hardy, 54, and Sarah Hardy, both of 205 Scott Court, Irvine, were each charged with trafficking in a controlled substance, second degree, first offense and trafficking in a controlled substance within 1000 feet of a school.

Bobby Hardy was arrested by citation and Sarah Hardy by indictment.

Court records state the two sold two lortab pills to a confidential informant on August 12, 2014. The illegal drug buy was within 1,000 feet of Estill Springs Elementary.

A Jackson County bench warrant was also served on Bobby Hardy for failing to appear for a court hearing on a possession of cocaine.

Phillip Glenn Jones, 40, of 114 Church Street, Irvine was indicted for trafficking in a controlled substance within 1,000 feet of a school and trafficking in a controlled substance, second degree on August 25, 2014.

The indictment says that Jones sold one suboxone to a confidential witness.

Samuel G. "Sam" Crowe, 59, of 445 Greens Crossing, Richmond, was indicted for trafficking in a controlled substance, first degree.

The indictment says that S. Crowe sold one oxycodone to a confidential witness on August 25, 2014 in Estill County.

An arrest warrant was served on Donna Stone, 33, of the same address as S. Crowe. She was charged with trafficking in a controlled substance, third degree.

Chief Smith said that Stone sold four xanax bars for \$48.00 to a cooperating witness on August 9, 2014.

Matthew Riddell, 34, of Wisemantown Apts. #5, was indicted for trafficking in a controlled substance second degree and trafficking in legend drugs.

The indictment says Riddell sold one subutex pill and 25 neurontin to a confidential informant on August 19, 2014.

Jack Reed Cockrell Jr., 56, of 810 South Irvine Road was served with a five-count indictment in jail where he has been since a drug bust at South Irvine on the first day of school.

The indictment charges Cockrell with two counts of trafficking in a controlled substance, first degree, trafficking in a controlled substance, third degree, and two counts of trafficking in a controlled substance within 1,000 feet of a school.

The indictment says that Cockrell sold one percocet at one time and two another, as well as a morphine pill to a confidential witness on August 4. He allegedly sold two xanax bars to the confidential witness.

James Garrett Rose, 58, of 860 South Irvine Road has also been in jail since the South Irvine drug bust. Rose was indicted for complicity to trafficking in a controlled substance, first degree and complicity to trafficking in a controlled substance within 1,000 feet of a school.

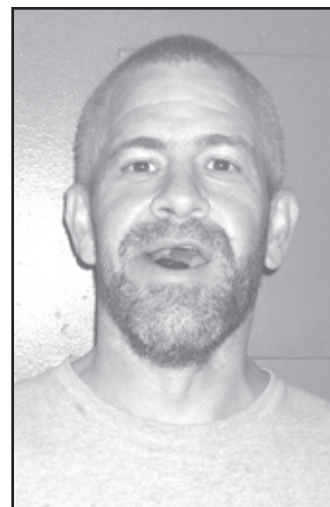
The indictment says that Rose acted in complicity with others to traffic in illegal substances by knowingly allowing the use of his business for trafficking on August 6, 2014.

Anthony Eugene Scenters, 50, of 614 Broadway, was indicted for trafficking in a controlled substance, first degree.

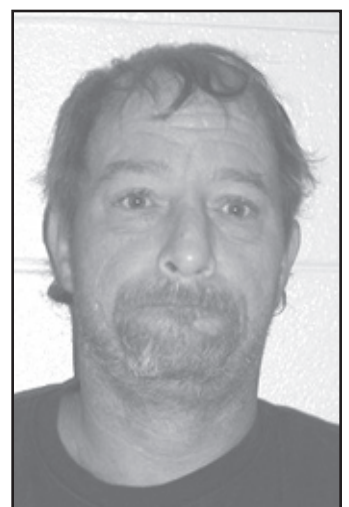
The indictment says on August 18, 2014, Scenters sold one oxycodone to a confidential witness.

125 Rogers Lane, Irvine was served with an indictment warrant in jail where he has been since early August.

The indictment charges Riddell with three counts of trafficking in a controlled substance, first degree, trafficking in a controlled substance within 1,000 feet of a school, possession of a controlled substance, first degree, prescription of controlled substance not in proper container, and drug paraphernalia.

The indictment says on January 31 of this year, Riddell sold one percocet to a confidential witness while within 1,000 feet of a school.

On August 14, the indictment says Riddell sold one percocet and on August 15 one oxycodone to a confidential informant.

The indictment says that Riddell possessed controlled substances on August 22 when he made a pocket call to the 911 dispatcher in which the dispatcher overheard a drug transaction. It also says that Riddell had a cut up straw and a keychain container with a percocet in it on August 23.

Regina Puckett, 46, of 114 4th Street, Ravenna was indicted on a single charge of trafficking in a controlled substance, second degree.
