A male resident of Turner Avenue was arrested Monday, Sept. 29 and charged with fourth degree assault (minor injury) during domestic violence.

Irvine police arrest E. Ky. man on forged prescriptions

Irvine Police Chief Brad Smith said that on Tuesday, Sept. 30, Joshua C. Adams, 35, of Jeremiah, Ky., had in his possession two forged prescriptions which had been stolen from the Whitesburg Medical Clinic.

Smith stated the prescription blanks had been forged, and the name of the issuing doctor was incorrect.

He also added that no prescription had been issued by the medical clinic to the person whose name was on the prescription blank. Smith stated that one of the prescriptions was for Royxcodone and the other was for Xanax.

He said that Adams admitted to dropping off the two prescriptions at a pharmacy on River Drive in Irvine.

Adams was charged with possession of a forged prescription for legend drug, first offense, forgery of a prescription, first offense, and two counts of receiving stolen property.


