If you are a child of God and you marry a child of the devil. You will be sure to have trouble with your father-in-law.

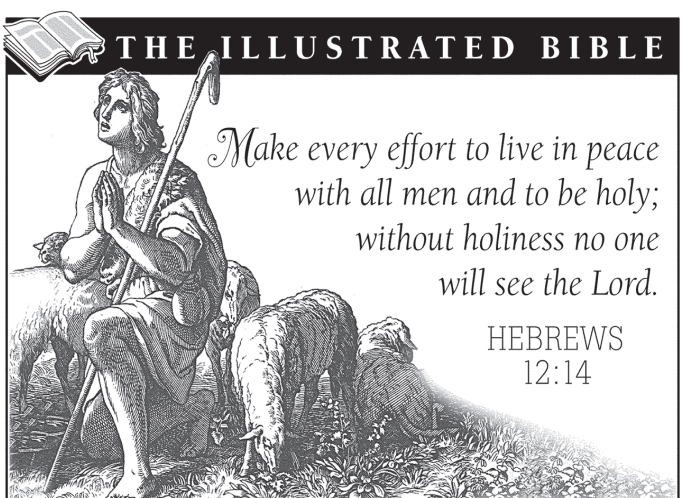
C. Hebrews 9:27
