

Medicare Open Enrollment Assistance

Medicare Open Enrollment period begins October 15th and ends December 7th. Plan costs and coverage change each year, so everyone with Medicare should review their plan to make sure it will continue to meet their health needs and budget. There may be a Medicare health or drug plan available with better coverage or lower costs beginning in 2015.

The Estill County Senior Center has trained benefit counselors to assist Medicare beneficiaries in reviewing prescription and health coverage options and enrollment. Our annual Medicare Open Enrollment Event is scheduled for Monday, November 10, 2014 from 9 am until 3 pm at the Estill County Senior Center located at 100 Golden Court, Irvine. You must call and schedule an appointment for the Open Enrollment Event (606) 723-4787.

In order to receive enrollment assistance, provide the following information:

- Name as it appears on your Medicare card
- Medicare Claim Number
- Effective date for Medicare Part A and/or Medicare Part B
- Mailing Address
- Telephone Number
- Current list of medications, including milligram and dosage
- Name of your pharmacy

Due to the large number of individuals seeking assistance at our annual event, we will begin individual plan comparisons on the first day of open enrollment. Beginning Wednesday, October 15, 2014 we will offer enrollment assistance. If you have received enrollment assistance through our agency in the past, then it is not necessary to attend our enrollment event.

Simply provide an updated medication list, complete the simple personal information sheet and staff will perform a plan comparison. Once staff have performed your comparison, you will be notified by phone or mail of any recommended changes.

If we have not assisted you in the past, and you are unable to attend our enrollment event, then you can pick up a personal information sheet from our agency, complete and return it to our office. Staff will perform a plan comparison and notify you by phone or mail of recommended changes.

There is no charge for assistance and it will be available Wednesday, October 15, 2014 through Friday, November 21, 2014. After that date, any requests for enrollment assistance will be referred to Medicare. For more information, please call the Estill County Senior Center at (606) 723-4787.

The apostle Paul wrote in Romans 1:16, "For I am not ashamed of the gospel: for it is the power of God unto salvation unto everyone that believeth." In closing,

We must study the Bible to be wise, obey it to be saved, believe it to be safe, practice it to be holy, for by it we will be eternally judged. **John 12:48**, "He that rejecteth me, and receiveth not my words, hath one that judgeth him: the word that I have spoken, the same shall judge him in the last day."

We often hear phrases such as "I just didn't have enough time," or "I ran out of time," or "If I only had more time." Time seems to elude all of us. Yet all of us try to regulate our lives by time. We wear watches, have watches and are "clock watchers."

One of the most interesting facts about time, however, is that it reveals our priorities. If we say that we love our wife and children, yet have little time for them or to be with them, our words are meaningless. If we say that we love our Lord and Savior, yet have no time for church or take no time to serve Him, our behavior mocks us and cancels our words. Our priorities are what matter. Our priorities are known to us and visible to others by the time we spend on "things."

Psalm 24 makes a bold statement: "The earth is the Lord's and everything in it." It reflects the words that introduce us to God: "In the beginning God created the heavens and the earth!" This verse states that God was the Creator. Furthermore, this Psalm states that the earth and everything in it belongs to Him. If so, He is to be the priority of our lives and everything we do is to be an act of worship - honoring Him in all that we do.

This Psalm clearly announces the Kingship of God. We are quick to recognize God as Creator but that is not enough for Him. As our Creator-King, He has every right to expect us, His subjects, to place Him first and foremost in our lives. We know He is our priority when we honor Him by what we do with our time.
