• I have a collection of model • railroad cars, G grade, which originally belonged to my husband. I am breaking up my home and would like to sell them. —Joan, Lombard, Ill.

A. The first thing that you should do is determine the value of your model railroad cars. Even though there are several excellent price guides, I especially like "O'Briens Collecting Toy Trains: Identification and Value," edited by David Doyle and published by Krause Books. This reference has more than 6,000 listings, including locomotives, cars, rolling stock and accessories. Since it is updated frequently, the prices seem to reflect the marketplace. To sell, you might want to post your collection on eBay to attract a national pool of buy-
