
Epperson CofG Chili Supper

Our lesson today is dealing with the realities of life, and of things that are certain and will not be changed. In the Old Testament Ezekial the prophet said, **chapters 33:7-9:** "that God has set the Holy men of Israel as watchmen over the nation.
