There will be a homecoming service with dinner following at the First Church of God at 199 Broadway in Irvine, Sunday, November 2, 2014.

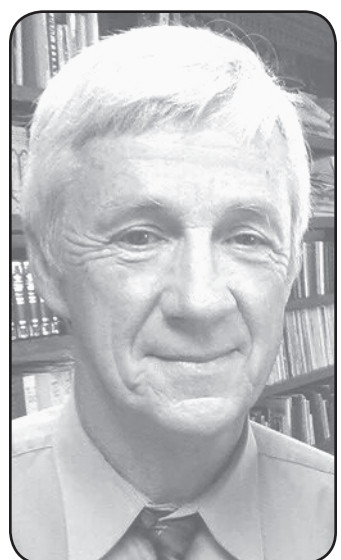
