Too many new young stems ("suckers") bush can compromise the vigor of the main plant. Remove them in the fall by digging down to the root and tearing

them away from the roots, getting as much of each stem as possible If they sprout up again, prune both the root and the young stem; they can grow a new tree. Plant elsewhere or give it to a friend. - Brenda Weaver
