State police investigate murder of Estill resident

The death of a 23 year old Estill County man is being investigated as a homicide.

William Cain was flown to the UK Hospital on November 21 after being involved in a wreck on Barnes Mountain.

The wreck was investigated by Estill Deputy Ethan Jordan.

A citation states the truck involved in the wreck had been reported stolen by Gene Isaacs. The truck was described as a 1998 green and silver colored Dodge. The deputy said there was no insurance on the truck.

According to the deputy, Cain had a strong odor of alcohol coming from his body. He was unsteady on his feet and had

slurred speech.

Cain was charged with receiving stolen property under \$10,000, failure to maintain insurance, alcohol intoxication in a public place, and criminal mischief first degree.

The stolen truck had damages to both sides of the steering column. Both tie rod ends were broken.

A report from the Fayette County coroner's office says that Cain was also involved in an assault. The coroner's office says that Cain died November 25 as a result of injuries he received in the assault. The cause of death is listed as blunt force injuries.

Police standoff ends peacefully Sunday afternoon on Lamar Dr.

A four-hour long standoff with police on Lamar Drive ended peacefully Sunday.

Kentucky State Police were called around 5 p.m. to an apartment on Lamar Drive, allegedly for threats made during domestic violence. One news report states the man threatened troopers if they entered his home.

Lamar Drive is near the

car wash on Winchester Road. In addition to a few apartment buildings, there are many single dwelling homes in the neighborhood.

Neighbors were evacuated. Some had not been home and attempted to return home only to be turned away.

After a hostage negotiator visited the distraught man, he surrendered around

9 p.m. to KSP without incident.

Police say the man was heavily armed. They add the man had a bow and arrows and a muzzle loader.

The man's name has not been released. Exact charges against him have not been released.

Police said the man is undergoing a mental evaluation.
