I wonder how many don't even stop and give thanks to God on Thanksgiving?

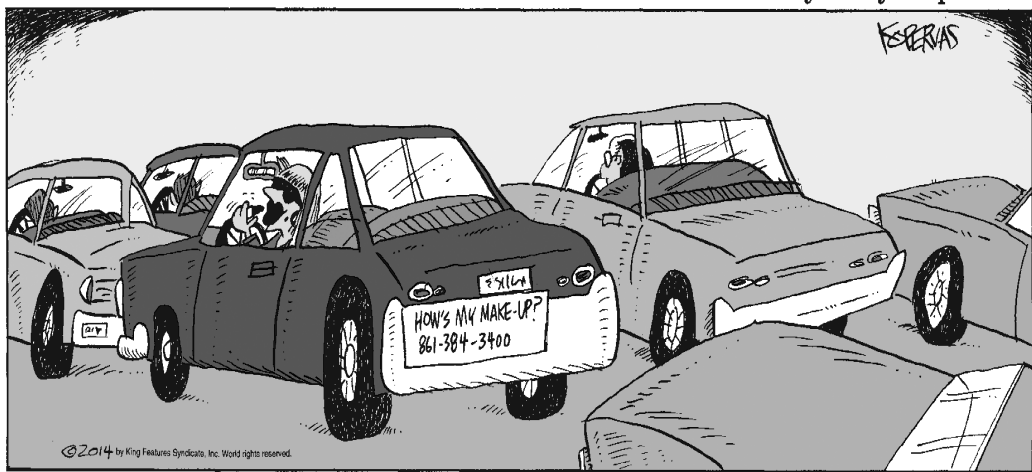
I give thanks every day for what God has given me.

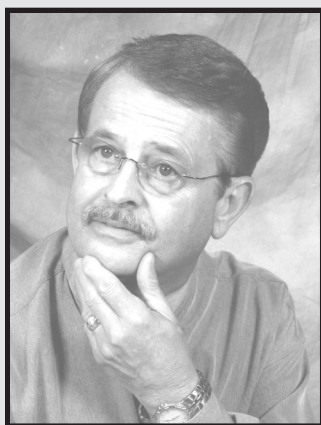
