

# Mike and Trevor Jones Named "3A Coach and Player of the Year"

Estill County received a rare honor over the weekend with the naming of Estill Coach Mike Jones and his son, Engineers quarterback Trevor Jones, as State 3A "Coach of the Year" and "Player of the Year" by the Kentucky Football Coaches Association.

"This is a great honor," said Estill principal Blain Click. "I'm certain father and son have won this state honor before but it seemed rather rare."

Estill was eliminated from playoffs a couple of weeks ago; so, the honors came at the KHSAA state finals held over the weekend at Bowling Green.

Trevor Jones played 33 1/2 Games in three seasons at Estill and has a 16-17 record as starter.

The Engineers quarterback had a career total of 405 carries for 3,130 yards, and 48 rushing touchdowns with 7.73 yards per carry.

He was 191-388 in passing with 2,755 yards 28 touchdowns - a 49.2% completion. He also had six 2-point conversions.

Defensively, Trevor had 150 solo tackles, 160 assisted tackles for 310 total. Twenty-

three of his tackles were for a loss, with one forced fumble, four fumble recoveries and five interceptions.

He scored six defensive/special teams touchdowns with 82 total touchdowns and 504 total points.

His 2014 offensive stats included 188 carries for 1601 yards rushing and 25 touchdowns - 133 yds. per game, 8.5 yds per carry.

He was 61-117 with 1017 yards passing and 11 touchdowns - 52% completion.

Trevor also had two return touchdowns this season with one interception, three fumble recoveries, one forced fumble, 18 tackles for loss, 51 solo tackles, 59 assisted tackles and 38 total touchdowns for 2014. He finished 3rd in rushing and 13th in passing in 3A this year.

Coach Mike Jones has coached here 14 years, 69 wins overall (69-84); best years 2003, 2008, 2014.

He had seven playoff appearances, and his teams have been among the top of the state in rushing yards for most of his stint at Estill.

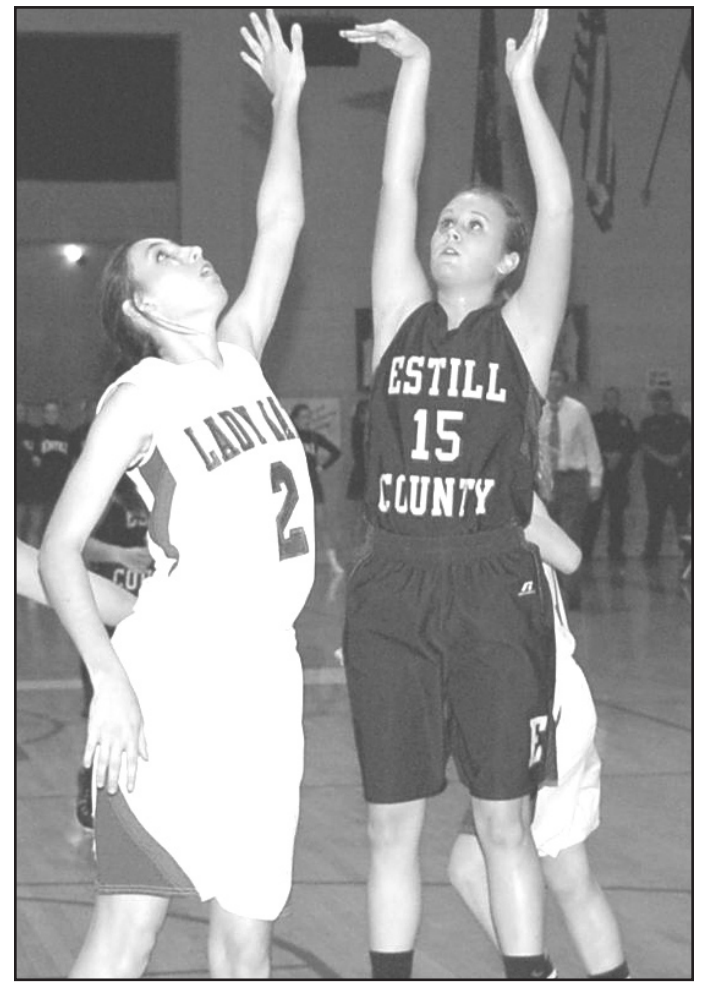
