tion classes. The web-based sessions will take place in 15 county Cooperative Extension offices around the state.

The first class will be held from 1 to 4 p.m. EDT on March 10. Subjects covered will include new trucking regulations, updates on logging legislation, the tie and stage log markets, the pulpwood market and the forest industry economic report for 2014 to 2015.

The second session will take place from 1 to 4 p.m. EDT March 17 and cover updates on the sawlog market and forest health; an interview with a Certified Master Logger whose life was saved because of having an emergency plan; biomass and chip mill development; new ticks and diseases; Best

Management Practices inspection procedures; information about the top BMP issues; and changes in Occupational Safety and Health Administration requirements for loggers.

Participants will be eligible for three continuing education units for each class. The programs will originate from the UK campus and stream live to extension offices in Edmonson, Estill, Harlan, Hopkins, Lawrence, Letcher, Lewis, Lyon, Perry, Pike, Pulaski, Rowan, Scott, Taylor, and Whitley coun-

ties. The format will allow the participants to ask questions of the presenters.

Order through February 20th

Fruit Tree Rootstock, etc.

The Estill Extension Service will be taking orders for apple and pear rootstocks this month. If you want to propagate a favorite apple or pear, grafting is one of the easiest ways to preserve that cultivar. To graft, you will need scion wood (terminal branch segments from last year's growth collected at the end of February) and a rootstock. If you do not know how to graft, come by the office for information or assistance.

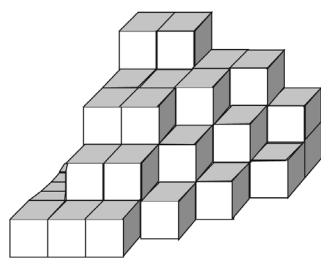
We typically order Malling7 (55% of standard size) and/or MM.111 (80% of standard) semi-dwarf apple rootstock and a pear rootstock. Please place your order on or before January 23rd by calling 606-723-4557. The rootstocks usually arrive by the first week of March. Orders must be prepaid by February 20th.

In addition, we will take orders for strawberry, blackberry, blueberry, raspberry, asparagus, and Candy onion plants. Call our office for details. Plant delivery will be in early April. If you are interested, call the Estill County Extension office at 723-4557. Orders must be prepaid by March 13th.

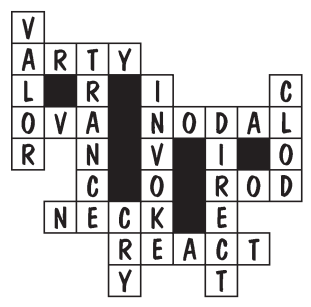

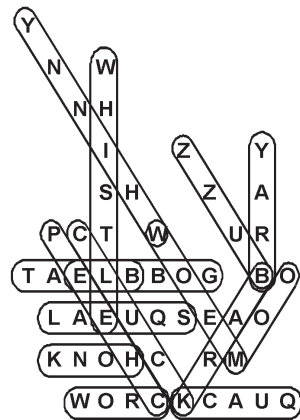
