The indictment was the result of a traffic stop made by Officer Sturniolo on Nov. 12, 2014.

Stephanie Abney, 24, Flinchum Ridge, Irvine, Roy Gross, 26, Winchester, George R. Smith, 22, Macedonia Road, Irvine, and Derrick Burns, 24, Macedonia Road, Irvine, were named as co-defendants in an indictment.

All four were indicted for receiving stolen property. The indictment says they pawned firearms on Dec. 4, 2014 which had been reported stolen by Jimmy Kelly.

Abney, Gross, and Smith were charged with possession of a firearm by a convicted felon. Abney and Smith were charged with being second degree persistent felony offenders, and Gross was charged with first degree persistent felony offender.

Deputy Morris was the lead investigator.

Bobby L. Mangum, 53, of Dugans Lane, Ravenna was indicted for cultivating marijuana, five plants of more, on July 16, 2014. The investigation was conducted by Kentucky State Police.

George R. Smith, 22, of Macedonia Road, Irvine was indicted for receiving stolen property and 2nd degree persistent felony offender.

The indictment says that Smith pawned items on Dec. 2, 2014 which had been reported stolen by William Durbin.

The investigating officer was Deputy Morris.

Cornelius Wilson Jr., 54, of Stacy Lane, Irvine was indicted on two counts of wanton endangerment, first degree. The indictment states that he pointed a handgun at Brandy Stinnett and Terry Young on August 8, 2014.

IPD Capt. McKinney led the investigation.

Travis Wayne Adams, 35, of Furnace Jct., Ravenna was indicted with public intoxication and possession of a controlled substance first degree.

The indictment says that on Nov. 28, 2014, Adams had a syringe containing methamphetamine in his pocket.

Deputy Ethan Jordan was

the investigator.

Royce Richardson, 41, of Sandhill Road, Irvine, was indicted for resisting arrest, possession of a firearm by a convicted felon and tampering with physical evidence.

The indictment states that Richardson attempted to hide a pill container from an officer on Nov. 22, 2014.

Deputy Jordan investigated the case.

An indictment charged Jimmy Puckett, 46, of Chamberlain Branch, Ravenna with nine counts of a forged instrument, second degree.

The indictment says that Puckett forged nine stolen checks and cashed them at three local businesses on December 26, 2014.

The investigation was conducted by Deputy Morris.

Joshua Cain Adams, 35, of Jeremiah, Ky. was indicted for possession of a forged prescription for legend drugs, first offense, forgery of a prescription, first offense, two counts of receiving stolen property under \$500 (prescription blanks), and 1st degree persistent felony offender.

IPD Chief Smith was the investigating officer.

James H. Hobbs, 27, of High Street, Irvine, was charged with trafficking in a controlled substance, second degree and first offense, and 2nd degree persistent felony offender.

The indictment says that Hobbs sold a suboxone to a confidential witness on Oct. 14, 2014.

Investigation was conducted by Chief Smith.

Jeremy D. Willis, 25, of Sandhill Road, Irvine was charged with theft by unlawful taking or disposition.

The indictment says that Willis took \$1,800 on Oct. 21, 2014 which belonged to Russell Morris Jr.

The investigation was conducted by KSP Trooper Z. Thompson.

Ricky Ruble, 35, of Red Lick Road, Irvine, was indicted for terroristic threatening, second degree.

According to the indictment, Ruble threatened to blow West Irvine School down and take it apart on October 27, 2014.

The alleged threat was investigated by Ravenna Officer James Gross, who also serves as Schools Resource Officer (SRO) for Estill County Schools.

Jeremy D. Wilson, 25, of Sandhill Road, Irvine was indicted for two counts of criminal possession of a forged instrument, second degree.

He allegedly forged two checks on Nov. 24, 2014 which had been taken from Letisha Morris. The checks were cashed at two local businesses.

KSP Trooper J. Carpenter was the investigating officer.

Cassius E. Townsend, 53, of Lynch Road, Irvine was indicted for sexual abuse, first degree, victim under 12 years of age.

The indictment says this crime occurred on August 29, 2013. It adds that Townsend subjected a child under 12 to sexual contact by force.

KSP Trooper Z. Thompson was the investigating officer.

Vania Maelee Holland aka Maelee Kirby, 50, of Riddell Clem Road, Irvine was indicted for trafficking in a controlled substance, first degree and first offense.

The indictment says that Holland sold a 30 mg. oxycodone to a confidential informant on Oct. 14, 2014 for \$40.

Capt. McKinney was the investigating officer.

An indictment was returned against William Andrew Kelly, 23, of Pea Ridge Road, Irvine, for two counts of trafficking in a controlled substance, first degree, second offense or greater, 2nd degree persistent felony offender, and tampering with physical evidence.

The indictment says that Kelly sold a 30 mg. oxycodone to a confidential informant for \$40 on Dec. 15. It adds that a 30 mg. oxycodone was found when a search warrant was executed which was intended to be trafficked.

It adds that Kelly threw his wallet with "change money" under the bed in an attempt to hide it.

Chief Smith conducted the investigation.

Mayor Estine Tipton explained that when she took over as the mayor of Ravenna that she had cut her pay in half to save the city money not knowing that doing so was actually illegal. After it was brought to her attention and she spoke with someone at the Kentucky League of Cities, Tipton said that she had to take the money in order to keep from breaking the law. She also explained that each full time employee had been given a gift of appreciation last month of \$200 each that made the payroll last month a little higher than usual.

"I'm trying to run this as straight as I can, I promise you all," stated Tipton.

Tipton announced that the city had received a grant from the Kentucky Office of Homeland Security to purchase new uniforms and digital cameras for the police officers. She said that she wanted the officers to have new jackets, dress uniforms, and good shoes. She added that she along with Amy Crowe and Jamie Hill would be travelling to Frankfort later in the week in hopes to obtain

more money for the city.

Councilwoman Tina Johnson stated that she had been questioned about Ricky Williams working for the city of Ravenna as well as being a constable. Mayor Tipton said that she had received a letter under the door at city hall about the same thing. She said that Williams being a constable and working for the city

was perfectly fine and that he was also on the volunteer fire department.

Before the meeting adjourned Larry Henry reminded the council that a roadblock would be held on April 4, 2015 to raise money to purchase flags for Veteran's graves. He said that any help from members of the council would be greatly appreciated.
