1 is arrested in break-ins and thefts



Video tape at D&J caught a burglar throwing a rock through the glass door around 3:30 a.m. Saturday.

A string of burglaries early Saturday morning ended with an arrest less than 48 hours later.

Sheriff Gary Freeman said the first burglary occurred at D&J True Value Hardware around 3:30 a.m. Saturday. The store's video camera caught the action.

The suspect threw a rock through the front door of the hardware store which shattered the glass. He then used his foot to kick out the remaining glass.

Sheriff Freeman said the perpetrator entered the store three times to remove five chainsaws and two knives. He broke the display case to remove the knives. The total value of the stolen items at D&J was \$3,272.06.

The perpetrator then went on to break in to the AT&T

Store on Richmond Road. Kentucky State Police are working this case.

The third break-in was unsuccessful at White House Clinic, also on Richmond Road.

Freeman said the clinic has a pharmacy inside.

Then a 2014 Harley - Davidson motorcycle was stolen from Coyote's, a motorcycle business on Richmond Road.

The break in this case came when someone who knew about the stolen bike saw a male riding the bike down Richmond Road around 8:48 p.m. Sunday night.

Deputy Randy Farthing said that male left the scene, but he located him a short distance away.

The deputy said he asked

the male to stop, but he fled on foot.

The deputy caught the male. He said the man's speech was slurred. His eyes were glassy and blood shot.

Farthing said the man admitted he had been riding the bike. He told Farthing that he had taken suboxone and klonzapam.

Farthing charged Elijah Stone, 27, of Old Log

Lick Road, Winchester with operating a motor vehicle under the influence of alcohol/drugs and with fleeing or evading police, second degree (on foot).

Farthing also charged Stone with receiving stolen property \$10,000 or more. He said Stone stated he knew the bike was stolen but denied stealing it.

Firefighters are called to apartment house in festival area, Saturday

One police car and a fire-truck loaded with firefighters left the parade and returned to the festival area to possibly fight an apartment house fire.

Residents of the apartments were evacuated.
