

Irvine police arrest 3 for trafficking in drugs IPD seeks man on drug related charges

Two adults and a juvenile were arrested as the result of a drug bust on Pea Ridge Road on April 30.

The Irvine Police Department is also seeking a third adult male in connection with drug related charges.

Irvine Police Captain Adrian McKinney obtained a search warrant for the residence of Anthony W. Cof-Road, Irvine.

The warrant was obtained on the fact that a controlled buy had been conducted at the residence a day earlier.

A citation issued on Coffey states that he sold suspected oxycodone to a confidential informant for \$40 on April 29.

During the execution of the search warrant, McKinney said that 16 30mg oxycodone were found in an improper container. \$745 was found in a billfold that had been thrown out a bedroom window.

Coffey was charged with trafficking in a controlled substance, 1st degree and 2nd offense, possession of fey, 47, of 1182 Pea Ridge a controlled substance, 1st degree and 1st offense, and prescription of a controlled substance, not in the proper container.

> Coffey pleaded not guilty to the charges in Estill District Court on May 1. A preliminary hearing was set for May 6.
