


Fallen Officers Are Remembered

Last week was a time to observe Fallen Officers, and a local observance was held at the Estill County Courthouse on Friday evening. A monument at the courthouse lists the names of officers which have died in the line of duty in Estill County, the latest being Irvine Police Chief Bob Walker. Walker's killer is serving a 25 year to life sentence. He was denied probation after 25 years but will be considered for probation again in a few years. The fallen officers included sheriffs. deputy sheriffs, police officers, police chiefs, and constables.
