Anthony Alexander, 12

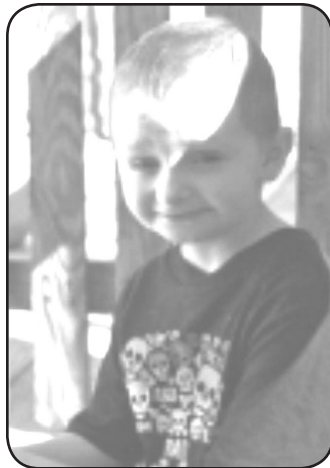
