## **Council to revise** city ordinances by CATHY DAWES

Irvine city clerk Robin Powell presented members of the council with the first chapter of ordinances to look over and see if they would like to amend any of them. Powell said that would give them two weeks to decide if they wanted to make any changes and then they would move on to the next chapter.

The council had discussed doing this at the meeting earlier in the month because so many of the ordinances are outdated.

Mayor James Gross spoke to the council about getting a credit card from Citizen's Guaranty Bank to use for purchases. He said that the credit card would be paid off each month. Because he was the mayor it would be in his name with his social security number attached to it.

Gross said that there have been several occasions when a credit card was needed to make a purchase, and they didn't have one. He added that Chief John Sturniolo had been paying for items for the K-9 out of his pocket, and the city would reimburse his money with a check. If the city had a credit card they would not have to do that.

"You just about have to have a credit card in this day and time to operate," stated Councilman Tim

The council agreed to the credit card with a \$5,000 limit with the exception that it be paid in full each month.
