



We are ready to open deer season, with a firearm, on (Saturday) November 14th, around the break of day. Please let us keep this a safe, enjoyable hunting season.

Keep in mind a few "MUST FOLLOW" rules. I have been on this earth for 75 years, and have always observed the rules I was taught at 6 years of age. I warn my hunting buddies, almost every hunt of these rules. So far, I have never

had an accident while handling a firearm. Keep the barrel of the firearm pointed away from you -- or anything you don't intend to shoot at. Bullets have no eyes, and once sent through the end of the barrel, you can't call them back. Best bet is to keep your firearm pointed toward the sky whenever possible.

The most dangerous I call hunters down on is while they are standing, waiting, they put their fingers, or palm over the end of the barrel. Let's ask Gary Richardson how that worked for him. Gary not only lost this hand, but also his ear.

Never bring a loaded firearm into camp. In my opinion, if you are too lazy to unload your firearm, which takes 10 seconds, you are also too lazy to hunt.

Anytime you drop your firearm, check your barrel to make sure it is still clear of debris. A longtime friend who has now left us, used to keep his hunting equipment in his little outbuilding; mud hornets built a nest in his barrel. He listened to me, checked it, and saved himself a lot of problems. It took us close to an hour to clean it all out.

Be sure of your target, again bullets have no

eyes. Never take a brush shot, know your target before you pull the trigger.

Always carry a First Aid kit, either on your person, or the least, in your truck. Extra flashlights, a rain suit; and one of the most important things to carry, and lots of it, is Char Men. I started hunting before paper towels were around. When they did make it to our home, I remember my Dad saying, "Son, be sure to take lots of Char-Man, one sheet is better than a hundred leaves."

And to close things out today, please, the kill is only the end of the hunt, not the beginning; a kill is not your main reason you are hunting, I will let you figure out why you hunt.

Finally, a trophy is in the eye of the beholder. What you may let pass, some hunters will hammer down. As long as it is legal, it is their trophy.

Start of 2020 football playoffs is delayed until November 19-20-21

The KHSAA notified member schools last week that the start of the football playoffs will be delayed one week in an effort to provide schools and school systems time to review their situations and work with their health departments to determine the best course of action. The first round of the playoffs will now take place the weekend of Nov. 19-21 with no additional planned changes in the playoff structure at this point in time.

In the meantime, schools and

school systems should review site strategies, seating capacities, and all other facets of the likely contest(s) during this interim period and certainly remind students that what they do outside of practice and the game field can have a tremendous impact on themselves and those around them. It is highly advised that all levels of school administration be in on hosting decisions and use this interim time to play out various "what if" scenarios based on hopefully changing data.

"It goes without saying that we are in the midst of issues within our state and the current status of the pandemic. I have stated all along that decisions made by our office, at any point in time, would be done so in the best interest of student-athletes. While it may be a calculated strategic decision that in time, we feel was not the best path, we have to make decisions based on today's information because tomorrow is so unknown," said KHSAA Commissioner Julian Tackett.

"This decision isn't just about the few ongoing quarantines, it's about 82 counties Friday being defined as "red" including the vast majority of the east. It's about giving our schools time to deal with the issues around athletics which are not identical to the issues around the school day and as such, may need separate local discussions.

"One of the deciding factors in this situation is determining what course of action to take given today's information, that we feel

gives our students the best chance to have a postseason experience. We have been calculated and strategic throughout this process and will continue to do so during these extremely challenging times, with the students' health and ability to participate both being at the forefront of our minds."

As a result of the postseason delay, the following guidelines will be in place for member schools. The first round will begin with the weekend of November 19-20-21.
