

Police Activity Report

One Injured in Wreck

A passenger was injured February 1 when a vehicle struck a parked police cruiser in Ravenna.

A report by Sheriff Chris Flynn said that Mark Stevens of Elm Street, Ravenna, was traveling east on Main Street of Ravenna when a westbound vehicle got into his lane of travel.

Stevens swerved to miss the westbound vehicle but his vehicle struck a Ravenna Police Department Cruiser parked on the side of the street in front of the police department.

According to the sheriff, both vehicles received significant damages.

Stevens was driving a Kia Sorento. The cruiser was a 2010 Ford Victoria.

Stevens was reportedly not injured. A female passenger in his vehicle was transported to Marcum & Wallace Hospital for treatment of her injuries.

The police cruiser was unoccupied.

Man charged with TICS

A Winchester Road man was charged with trafficking in a controlled substance, first degree, second or greater offense on February 8.

KSP Trooper Ty Robinson and Sheriff Chris

Flynn went to the residence of Wade Smith, 52, to serve two warrants on him from Estill Circuit Court.

When the officers arrived, a male answered the door. He told them that Smith was inside and in the living room.

Trooper Robinson said he found Smith in the living room asleep on the couch. He woke Smith up and told him that he had warrants for his arrest.

During a search after the arrest, Trooper Robinson reported locating a white container in the pocket of Smith's jeans. Inside it were three individually wrapped foil packages that contained suspected methamphetamine.

Smith was placed under arrest and taken to the Estill County Courthouse. He was then transported to Marcum & Wallace Hospital to be treated for a collar bone injury that needed medical attention.

Smith was then transported to Kentucky River Medical Center in Jackson for preparation of surgery on his injured shoulder.

Smith was cited to court and released on the above charge.

Arrests Made

He also served a failure to appear warrant for Estill court.

Officer Russell Morris charged **Crystal Hatton**, 37, of S. Winn Avenue Irvine with operating a motor vehicle under the influence and possession of marijuana on February 2.

The citation states the officer was dispatched to N. Plum Street to a single vehicle wreck. When the officer arrived, he stated that Hatton was trying to back her car out of a ditch. She reportedly failed field sobriety tests, and Morris said he saw her hide something under the car, which was marijuana.

Officer R. Morris served three warrants from Estill District Court on **William Bray**, 40, of Richmond Road, Irvine. Two were for traffic offenses and the third was a misdemeanor.

Officer S. Morris arrested **Adam Glenn McIntosh**, 33, on February 1 and charged him with alcohol intoxication in a public place.

The citation states the officer received a report that McIntosh had assaulted a female friend in Ravenna. He had left the residence and was walking on River Drive.

Jacqueline M. Riddell, 41, of 8th Street, Ravenna was served with an Estill District Court warrant on February 3 by Officer Conrad.

The same officer also charged Riddell with violation of a Kentucky EPO/DVO when he was dispatched to 214 Broadway. Because of an active EPO, Riddell was not to be at that location.

On February 5, Officer S. Morris arrested **Ashley Isaacs**, 19, of Spout Springs Road, Irvine on a probation violation for a felony offense in Bourbon County.

Deputy Chris Coffey was called to Marcum & Wallace Hospital on February 6 because an 11 year old boy wanted to talk to him about an assault.

Coffey said he immediately noticed marks on the right side of the boy's face and cheek. There was also a mark on the left cheek.

The boy told the deputy that a man had body slammed him, which made him hit his face on the ground.

The youngster added the man had also put his arm around his neck and choked him. Then the man put his hand around the boy's neck and choked him.

The indictment states that on November 3, Berryman intentionally caused serious physical injury to Amy Riddell with a knife and brass knuckles.

The indictment adds that Berryman has previously been convicted of one prior felony offense.

KSP Trooper Casey Caudill investigated the reported assault.

Eric Raider, 29, of Glory Street, Irvine was named in a three-count indictment as the result of a traffic stop on July 12 by Trooper Caudill.

Raider was indicted for reckless driv-

ing, operating a motor vehicle under the influence of alcohol/drugs, etc., and possession of a controlled substance, first degree and first offense.

The indictment states that Raider's vehicle was weaving from side to side in his lane. He was also allegedly driving at a high rate of speed.

It adds that Raider had methamphetamine in his possession.

The grand jury returned a report of no indictment on six charges, Counts 3 through 8, of the complaint brought by Trooper Caudill. The report says there were insufficient votes by the grand jury.
