Irvine Fire Department is getting a new truck paid by CSEPP funds

Lucas Barnes, deputy director of CSEPP, spoke to members of the Irvine council on Monday night on a few current projects that will benefit the city of Irvine.

Barnes said that city Active pallbearers were will have a new fire truck soon that will be owned by CSEPP. The truck will be fully funded and will come er, Jermaine Norris, Trent with some equipment, but the city will be required to pay the insurance and the maintenance of the new vehicle.

He stated there will also be new equipment for the firefighters as well, as some lap tops that will be distributed between the Spurlin Funeral Home of fire departments in the county.

Councilman Tim Burkhart asked how much longer CSEPP would be funded. Barnes replied that congress has agreed to fund it until December 2023 but could be sooner depending on when the last ammunitions are disposed of at the Bluegrass Army Depot.

He stated they had knocked on doors and that people were very understanding and knew that they were noncompliant, and that they have not had to write any citations.

Sturniolo said that he wanted to commend the sanitation workers because they had worked their tails off picking up all the garbage that had been set out Monday morning.

Mayor Gross added that sanitation workers had picked up close to 100 tires on Broadway alone and that they had been taken to the recycling center.

Sturniolo brought a proposal to the table to enter into a contract with New Vista to do video conferencing at Marcum and Wallace for individuals who were brought in on an emergency mental detention.

He said that only 23 video conferencing would save the officer's time and also the fuel of travelling back and forth to Lexington. New Vista would supply everything that would be needed except the hardware.
