Those cattle are now on someone's farm, but Flynn wants their owner to come and identify them.

County Attorney Jason Riley said a state statute addresses cattle and horses running at large. He said the law does not apply to goats or pigs.

The law does allow for others to take possession of the animals.

He said it also makes the owner responsible for any damages.

Judge/Executive Donnie Watson said that an eight hour employee has been added to third shift at the county fire department.

He said the department's rating had gone from a 5 to 3, and he wanted to maintain the rating.

Magistrate Gerry Flannery said that his insurance had gone down by \$120 due to the new rating.

Watson said the fire rate will decrease only for residents within five miles of the fire department.

Fire Chief Derrick Muncie said a man on duty allows a faster response, and there are usually a lot more runs on weekends.

Muncie said the fire department has made 17 runs this month, including four structure fires. Two of them were electrical last Monday. On Friday, a light bulb broke and caused a mattress to catch fire. Another fire was reported on Red Lick.

Watson said that Teleworks is offering work from home jobs, which are legitimate.

"They can place 1,500 jobs right now," he stated.

He will be visiting the Teleworks hub in Jackson County soon.

He encouraged people to participate in the census once more.

"A lot of money is hinging on it," he said.

It is estimated that \$4,200 is available for every person counted.

Watson said that Winkler Cemetery Road has always been in the creek.

"We're going to move that road out of the creek," he stated.

Tony Tipton, from Mount Sterling and a board member on Hollarwood Park, updated the fiscal court about the park.

Besides Estill, Powell, Wolfe, and Lee Counties are involved in the off-road recreational park.

"Hopefully, the park will become self sufficient," Tipton stated.

He said there are grants out there, but the park must be owned before eligible for the grants. It is currently leased.

The fiscal court updated the resolution supporting the Second Amendment, the right to bear arms.

Language referring to a sanctuary county was added. It further adds that it is for a sanctuary county for weapons only and not illegal persons.

Watson said the District 10 office had informed him that Estill County will be receiving \$911,503 allotment for roads this year.

Of that amount, \$448,420 will be spent on county roads.

The state plans to resurface portions of KY 851 (Doe Creek Road) and KY 1353 (Trotting Ridge Road) at an estimated cost of \$403,755.

Watson said the state has asked the county to give some of their road money back to the state.

"We need that money," stated Flannery.

The fiscal court tabled bids on a fire truck for the Irvine Fire Department. The truck will be paid for with CSEPP funds, but because the city of Irvine will have to pay for insurance, etc., the council must agree before the bid is accepted.

Bid for a fire truck for the Estill County Fire Department was accepted from South East Apparatus for \$250,315. The truck will be delivered in about 52 weeks.

Bids were also accepted for medical equipment, which will go to schools, the courthouse, and EMS.

The bid for medical equipment is contingent upon state approval. The fire trucks and medical equipment will be paid for with CSEPP funds.

Jimmy Wise, director of Estill EMS, said the ambulance service will get power cots.

He said people are getting heavier, and the cost will lift a person up to 750 pounds. He adds this is also easier on the EMS employees.

The fiscal court agreed to advertise for bids for supporting equipment for the Estill County, Irvine, Hargett and Ravenna fire departments, such as cascade systems.

Adam Tipton was hired as a jail transport officer at \$10 an hour.
