How to Protect Yourself and Others

Know how it spreads

- There is currently no vaccine to prevent coronavirus disease 2019 (COVID-19).
- **The best way to prevent illness is to avoid being exposed to this virus.**
- The virus is thought to spread mainly from person-to-person.
 - Between people who are in close contact with one another (within about 6 feet).
 - Through respiratory droplets produced when an infected person coughs, sneezes or talks.
 - These droplets can land in the mouths or noses of people who are nearby or possibly be inhaled into the lungs.
 - Some recent studies have suggested that COVID-19 may be spread by people who are not showing symptoms.

Everyone should

Clean your hands often

- **Wash your hands** often with soap and water for at least 20 seconds especially after you have been in a public place, or after blowing your nose, coughing, or sneezing.
- If soap and water are not readily available, use a **hand sanitizer that contains at least 60% alcohol**. Cover all surfaces of your hands and rub them together until they feel dry.
- **Avoid touching your eyes, nose, and mouth** with unwashed hands.

Avoid close contact

- **Avoid close contact** with people who are sick.
- **Stay at home as much as possible.**
- **Put distance between yourself and other people.**
 - Remember that some people without symptoms may be able to spread virus.
 - This is especially important for **people who are at higher risk of getting very sick.** www.cdc.gov/coronavirus/2019-ncov/need-extra-precautions/people-at-higher-risk.html

Cover your mouth and nose with a cloth face cover when around others

- **You could spread COVID-19 to others** even if you do not feel sick.
- **Everyone should wear a cloth face cover when they have to go out in public**, for example to the grocery store or to pick up other necessities.
 - Cloth face coverings should not be placed on young children under age 2, anyone who has trouble breathing, or is unconscious, incapacitated or otherwise unable to remove the mask without assistance.
- **The cloth face cover is meant to protect other people** in case you are infected.
- Do **NOT** use a facemask meant for a healthcare worker.
- Continue to **keep about 6 feet between yourself and others.** The cloth face cover is not a substitute for social distancing.

Cover coughs and sneezes

- **If you are in a private setting and do not have on your cloth face covering, remember to always cover your mouth and nose** with a tissue when you cough or sneeze or use the inside of your elbow.
- **Throw used tissues** in the trash.
- Immediately **wash your hands** with soap and water for at least 20 seconds. If soap and water are not readily available, clean your hands with a hand sanitizer that contains at least 60% alcohol.

Clean and disinfect

- **Clean AND disinfect frequently touched surfaces** daily. This includes tables, doorknobs, light switches, countertops, handles, desks, phones, keyboards, toilets, faucets, and sinks. www.cdc.gov/coronavirus/2019-ncov/prevent-getting-sick/disinfecting-your-home.html
- **If surfaces are dirty, clean them:** Use detergent or soap and water prior to disinfection.

Samantha Puckett Inducted into Honor Society of Phi Kappa Phi

Samantha Puckett of Irvine, Kentucky, was recently initiated into The Honor Society of Phi Kappa Phi, the nation's oldest and most selective all-discipline collegiate honor society. Puckett was initiated at Eastern Kentucky University.

Puckett is among approximately 30,000 students, faculty, professional staff and alumni to be initiated into Phi Kappa Phi each year. Membership is by invitation only and requires nomination and approval by a chapter. Only the top 10 percent of se-

niors and 7.5 percent of juniors are eligible for membership. Graduate students in the top 10 percent of the number of candidates for graduate degrees may also qualify, as do faculty, professional staff and alumni who have achieved scholarly distinction.

Phi Kappa Phi was founded in 1897 under the leadership of undergraduate student Marcus L. Urann who had a desire to create a different kind of honor society: one that recognized excellence in all academic disciplines. Today, the

After Resurrection Sunday - What Now?

Sunday, April 19, 2020 Morning Message
Bro. Warren Rogers, Ivory Hill Baptist Church

Here is my sermon I preached at our first drive-in service on Sunday, April 19, 2020. Had a good attendance and lots of enthusiasm.

We just celebrated the death, burial and resurrection of our Savior, Jesus Christ. We looked last week at Psalm 22:1-21 and compared it to the story in the four gospels of the events of the cross. As we look on this part of Chapter 22, it shows how we are to live after we realize what God has done for us.

Read **Psalm 22:22-31** and then we will start: "I will declare thy name unto my brethren: in the midst of the congregation will I praise thee. ²³Ye that fear the LORD, praise him; all ye the seed of Jacob, glorify him; and fear him, all ye the seed of Israel. ²⁴For he hath not despised nor abhorred the affliction of the afflicted; neither hath he hid his face from him; but when he cried unto him, he heard.

The first 2/3 of this Psalm is a prophecy about the crucifixion of Jesus. It is very graphic and very detailed. It is probably the clearest and most obvious reference to the cross in the Old Testament. But it changes in the last 1/3 to praise because of the faithfulness of God and the results of those actions.

Looking at Verse 22, we see that David is led to go straight into a public testimony after he realized just what God had planned. We must be prepared to offer praise and thanksgiving when God performs a miracle in our lives or when we realize just how much it cost our Savior that day.

You might say or ask; I've never had a miracle in my life. Did you ever think that maybe the day you accepted the Lord as your Savior was a miracle? He led you out of the pits of hell and gave to you life eternal in Heaven. Now think, how much more can He do before you realize a miracle? If you had not accepted the Lord as your Savior you were doomed to spend eternity in hell. Now can I hear a AMEN! Glory to our Lord and Savior for loving us so much that he was obedient to the desires of his father, came to live and die for us. Oh how I wished I was preaching in public right now. Sitting here getting so fired up I can hardly type for the tears. I know for sure that God performed a miracle in my life. I was on the road to hell, lost as a ball in high weeds, when He graciously came into my life.

How about you? Can you or do you ever give God the praise He deserves? Tell someone what Jesus means to you. They would rather hear that than you to read from the bible.

God comes in the quiet moments when we are hurting, and we must be prepared to offer public praise for his care.

²⁵My praise shall be of thee in the great congregation: I will pay my vows before them that fear him. ²⁶The meek shall eat and be satisfied: they shall praise the LORD that seek him: your heart shall live for ever. ²⁷All the ends of the world shall remember and turn unto the LORD: and all the kindreds of the nations shall worship before thee.

2 Chronicles 7:14 "If my people, which are called by my name, shall humble themselves, and pray, and seek my face, and turn from their wicked ways; then will I hear from heaven, and will forgive their sin, and will heal their land."

If ever a time the United States needed healing it is now. Sin is on a rampage; we hear and see things now that we have never heard of before. People turn their heads when they see things that are wrong, not wanting to get involved. I will never quit preaching against the evils of this world.

²⁸For the kingdom is the LORD'S: and he is the governor among the nations. ²⁹All they that be fat upon earth shall eat and worship: all they that go down to the dust shall bow before him: and none can keep alive his own soul.

Over a thousand years later, Paul wrote in **Romans 14:11**, "For it is written, As I live, saith the Lord, every knee shall bow to me, and every tongue confess to God."

There is coming a time and I think it is on the horizon that Jesus shall come for his church and those that remain will bow and cry out to God -- but it will be too late.

How about you? Have you accepted the Lord Jesus Christ as your Savior? Or are you putting it off until a later date. That is very dangerous my friend. You never know when your time to die is up. Why chance going to hell?

In **verses 30-31**, we see that unborn generations are depending upon our faithfulness today. ³⁰A seed shall serve him; it shall be accounted to the Lord for a generation. ³¹They shall come, and shall declare his righteousness unto a people that shall be born, that he hath done this."

Proverbs 22:6, "Train up a child in the way he should go: and when he is old, he will not depart from it."

As we teach our children about the Lord, they in turn will teach their children and their children's children. We must view our children and all the young people we meet as God's future leaders.

In closing (the words that the congregation likes to hear) I must ask you, "How do you stand before the Lord? Have you humbled yourselves to the point that you are willing to do what God wants in your life?"

Are you raising your children in fear and admonition for the Lord? Or do you just send them to Sunday School? You are the example that they see most. What you teach them they will never forget. Even though they might depart for awhile, they will always remember and are likely to return to God's house.
