Sunday, June 21st, 2020 Morning Message Bro. Warren Rogers, Ivory Hill Baptist Church Read Iob 14:1-14

We often hear, "There is life after death." On the wall of a cemetery in a strife-torn section of Belfest, Ireland, someone had spray painted these words, "Is there a life before death?"

Christ in speaking to Martha in **John 11:25**-**26,** says, "I am the resurrection, and the life: he that believeth in me, though he were dead, yet shall he live: 26 And whosoever liveth and believeth in me shall never die. Believest thou this?"

The Holy Spirit *empowers* or *leads* us to become a new person. In Christ you are a new person -- a new creation. This means that regardless of your life in this world, you must certainly have life before death. You must have a life before death to have life after death.

John Wesley (1703-1791 - founder of Methodism) had always thought of himself as a Christian, but one day aboard a ship that got caught in a storm on the Atlantic Ocean, Wesley was scared. He noticed that the only persons aboard who were not terror-stricken were some missionaries. When the storm died down, he asked one of them, "Were you not afraid?"

"Afraid," said the missionary. "Why should I be? I know Christ." Then looking at Wesley, he asked, "Do you know Christ?"

For the first time, Wesley realized he did not know him. Those missionaries had actually received what Jesus Christ is capable of providing. You need that king of salvation; you need that kind of life.

So many times people walk around thinking they are saved but they never really took Jesus in their heart. Like John Wesley, they think of themselves as Christians. This causes a person to be afraid when in times of trouble and strife, as they face the storms of life.

We need to live so that when these times come, we full trust Jesus Christ to take care of us instead of falling apart. We need to have a life that has no fear of what may come our way, we still trust Jesus.

Just before **Job** 14:1-14, in verses **11:13-20**, Job's friend Zophar had assured Job that there was hope for him if only he would acknowledge his sins and repent. "If thou prepare thine heart, and stretch out thine hands toward him; 14If iniquity be in thine hand, put it far away . . . "

**#1** Consider your present condition. Do you know where you will spend eternity? We have to have life before death.

**Proverbs 8:32-35,** tells us "Now therefore hearken unto me, O ye children: for blessed are they that keep my ways. 33 Hear instruction, and be wise, and refuse it not. 34Blessed is the man that heareth me, watching daily at my gates, waiting at the posts of my doors." Proverbs 22:4 adds, "By humility and the fear of the LORD are riches, and honour, and life"

**1 John 5:11-12** says, "And this is the record, that God hath given to us eternal life, and this life is in his Son. <sup>12</sup>He that hath the Son hath life; and he that hath not the Son of God hath not life."

**#2** Do you know when you will enter the hereafter? James 4:14 says "Whereas ye know not what shall be on the morrow. For what is vour life? It is even a vapour, that appeareth for a little time, and then vanisheth away." and Ec**clesiastes 3:1-2** tells us, "To every thing there is a season, and a time to every purpose under the heaven: <sup>2</sup>A time to be born, and a time to die; a time to plant, and a time to pluck up that which is planted."

**#3** If you knew that it would be tomorrow or next week, would you live your life any differently? In Luke 16:19, the rich man said, send Lazarus to tell my brothers. In **Acts 26:28**, King Agrippa told Paul, "almost thou persuadest me to be a Christian."

Job speaks about *life before death* in Job 14:1-6. Job's point of view was that no one, not even a supposed righteous person is exempt from suffering. "Man that is born of a woman is of few days, and full of trouble. <sup>2</sup>He cometh forth like a flower, and is cut down: he fleeth also as a shadow, and continueth not."

Job speaks about *life after death* in Job 14:7-14, "130 that thou wouldest hide me in the grave, that thou wouldest keep me secret, until thy wrath be past, that thou wouldest appoint me a set time, and remember me!14If a man die, shall he live again? all the days of my appointed time will I wait, till my change come."

Romans 8:10 tells us, "And if Christ be in you, the body is dead because of sin; but the Spirit is life because of righteousness."
