Next Tuesday, June 23 is primary election day, and this will be the only voting location open from 6 a.m. to 6 p.m. There are 14 voting stations inside and they are sanitized after each use. The deadline to obtain an absentee ballot has passed. They must be postmarked by June 23 for a vote to be counted.
