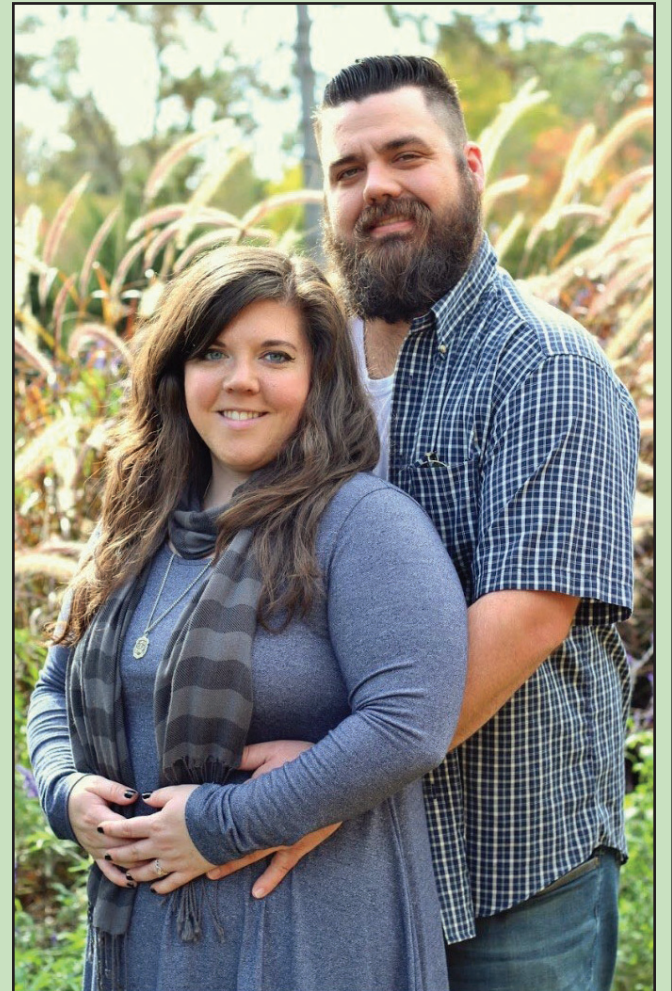




Estill Senior Places 2nd in Virtual FPS Competition

2020 Estill County High School graduate Elizabeth Tipton competed virtually in the KAAC Individual FPS competition on Wednesday, April 29, 2020. The competition took place over the month, using Google Sheets for the first time as the format. Teams and individuals competed remotely from their homes for an invitation to the FPSPI International Conference. Elizabeth received notification on May 7th that she placed 2nd and is the state runner up for the high school division. By placing in the top 10 she will also be recognized as a Kentucky Champion. She will also be competing virtually in the FPSPI International Conference against other individuals from Kentucky, from across the country, and from around the world. Elizabeth Tipton is a 2020 graduate at ECHS. She was the captain of the academic team and the FPS team. She was also a member of the state finalist team that competed in Massachusetts last year at UMass, where they were ranked 17th in the world. She has competed in Estill Academics for the past 10 years.
