Firefighter arrested for rape & sodomy of female teenager

An Estill County man was arrested the Hargett Fire Department. Friday and charged with raping and sodomizing a young woman.

According to a citation, Detective E. tion. Warrick of KSP Post 7 spoke to the victim around 9 p.m. Thursday.

over a three year period at her home.

The citation states that the man first began touching her inappropriately in the butt, breast, and private area.

She reportedly told the detective that the relationship graduated, and she was having sexual relations with the male, including intercourse and oral sex.

The next day, the detective interviewed the accused male, Jerry Lynn Goosey, 32, of Shallow Creek Lane, Irvine.

The citation states that Goosey confessed to having oral sex and sexual intercourse with the victim, who was only 17 years old when the initial incident occurred. The female reportedly told the detective the sexual behavior between her and Goosey ended a month
