• Have completed at least 2 years (360 hours) of systematic school instruction in agricultural education at or above the ninth grade level, which includes an SAE.

• Have earned and productively invested at least \$1000 and worked at least 300 hours in excess of scheduled class time, in a supervised agricultural experience program.

• Demonstrated leadership ability by performing parliamentary law procedures, giving a six-minute speech on a topic relating to agriculture or FFA, and serving as an FFA officer, committee chairperson, or committee member.

• Have a satisfactory academic record, certified by the agriculture teacher and the school principal or superintendent.

• Participated in the planning and implementation of the chapter's Program of Activities.

• Completed ten activities above the chapter level in at least three of six different categories: leadership development events, career development events, conventions and meetings, project shows, student awards and leadership and service.

• Complete at least 25 hours of community service in a minimum of two different activities.

The State FFA Degree is the highest degree awarded to members by the State FFA Association, and demonstrates the student has put an exceptional amount of time into their Supervised Agriculture Experience Program (SAE) and into their local Chapter. Congratulations to Holly and Erika on reaching their goal of obtaining the Kentucky FFA Degree.
