

# Estill grand jury returns 22 indictments

According to the indictment, Goosey possessed fentanyl and methamphetamine on April 25.

Deputy Josh King was the investigating officer.

James R. Adams, 53, was indicted for possession of a controlled substance, first degree and first offense.

The indictment says that Adams had oxycodone in his possession on May 12.

Glenn Carroll from the Estill County Sheriff's Office conducted the investigation.

Dustin Reynolds, 27, was indicted for violation of a Ky. EPO/DVO, theft by unlawful taking or disposition - auto, second degree burglary, and being a first degree persistent felony offender.

On June 8, Reynolds entered his father's house with the intent to commit a crime, according to the indictment. It adds that he violated an EPO against his father.

The indictment adds that he had a white Toyota which had been reported stolen.

Reynolds has been convicted of two previous felony offenses.

Sgt. Josh Rison with the Estill Sheriff's Office conducted the investigation.

Christopher Rose, 41, of Rosemont Road, Irvine was indicted for possession of a firearm by a convicted felon and receiving stolen property.

The indictment says that Rose had a stolen Savage 30-06 bolt action rifle in his possession on April 17.

The investigating officer was KSP Trooper Jonathan A. Bowman.

Jimmy Lee Draggoo, 57, of Wall Street, Irvine was indicted for theft of motor vehicle registration plate, possession of a controlled substance,

first degree and first offense, public intoxication of a controlled substance (excludes alcohol), and resisting arrest.

On February 1, Draggoo had a junked registration plate on his vehicle and methamphetamine, the indictment states. It adds that he was under the influence of methamphetamine and marijuana in a public place while resisting arrest.

The arresting officer was KSP Trooper Casey Caudill.

Charles Nutter, 41, of Henry White Road, Irvine was indicted for possession of a controlled substance, first degree and second offense and drug paraphernalia - buy/possess.

According to the indictment, Nutter possessed fentanyl and a needle on May 14.

The investigation was conducted by KSP Trooper Ty Robinson.

A three-count indictment was returned against Robert Archibald, 41, of Dug Hill Road, Irvine. It charges him with possession of a controlled substance, first degree and first offense, drug paraphernalia - buy/possess, and possession of a controlled substance, third degree.

The indictment states that on November 22, Archibald had methamphetamine, a straw with residue on it, and gabapentin in his possession.

The investigating officer was Jessica Hall of Probation & Parole.

Jacob Harrison, 28, of Wall Street, was indicted for having a handgun in his possession and resisting arrest on July 1.

The arresting officer was IPD Officer Jason Conrad.

Michael Craig Stampfer, 44, of Cob Hill Road, Irvine, was indicted on

three counts of possession of a controlled substance, first degree and first offense.

According to the indictment, he had three pink tablets identified as oxycodone, two white tablets, suspected hydrocodone, and methamphetamine in his possession on March 24.

Deputy Josh King was the investigating officer.

Vanessa Jones, 43, of Raintree Court, Irvine was indicted for possession of a controlled substance, first degree and first offense, possession of a controlled substance, third degree, and drug paraphernalia - buy/possess.

The indictment says she had methamphetamine, gabapentin, and needles and a pipe with residue on it on March 19.

Deputy Chris Coffey conducted the investigation.

A five count indictment was returned against Brian Hall, 48, of West Cedar Grove Road, Irvine.

The charges included possession of a handgun by a convicted felon, trafficking in a controlled substance, first degree and first offense, possession of a controlled substance, second degree, possession of marijuana, and drug paraphernalia - buy/possess.

The indictment says that Hall had the handgun, 8.3 grams of methamphetamine, buprenorphine-naloxone, 2.5 grams of marijuana, and 18 syringes, two sets of digital scales, a glass pipe, and over 100 plastic bags on June 30.

Detective Sam Hensley conducted the investigation.

Camille Congleton, 44, of Beattyville was indicted on two counts of possession of a controlled

substance, first degree and first offense (methamphetamine and oxycodone), possession of a controlled substance, third degree (alprazolam) and public intoxication of a controlled substance, excluding alcohol.

Detective Hensley conducted that investigation on May 26.

Maria Swinford, 44, of Turner Ave., Irvine was indicted for possession of a controlled substance, first degree and first offense (methamphetamine) and drug paraphernalia - buy/possess (a black straw for use of illegal substances) on April 12.

Irvine Officer James Marshall was the investigating officer.

An indictment charges James Young, 63, of Locust Branch Road, Irvine with criminal mischief, first degree.

The indictment states that Young intentionally damaged a 1998 Toyota Corolla belonging to Chris Croucher on March 7.

It adds that Young damaged the Toyota with an axe, causing over \$1,000 in damages.

The investigating officer was Trooper Caudill.

Jerri Sneed, 33, address unknown was indicted for fraudulent use of a credit card between over \$500 but less than \$10,000 and being a first degree persistent felony offender.

The indictment says that on November 25, Sneed obtained card numbers belonging to Linda Isaacs and obtained \$3,303.51. She has previously been convicted of at least two felonies.

Trooper Caudill conducted the investigation.

A four-count indictment was returned against Timothy McKinney, 32, of Redbud Road, Irvine.

McKinney was indicted for possession of a hand-

gun by a convicted felon, trafficking in a controlled substance, first degree and first offense, drug paraphernalia - buy/possess, and being a first degree persistent felony offender.

The indictment says on November 24, McKinney had the handgun, 9.109 grams of methamphetamine, and a set of small scales.

Sheriff Chris Flynn was the investigating officer.

Craig Johnson, 38, of Chamberlain Branch, Irvine was indicted for two counts of trafficking in a controlled substance, first degree and first offense (fentanyl and .858 gram of cocaine), trafficking in a controlled substance, first degree and second or greater offense (12.135 grams of methamphetamine), drug paraphernalia - buy/possess (plastic baggies, digital scale, cook spoon and four loaded syringes), and being a first degree persistent felony offender.

Irvine Police Chief John Sturniolo conducted that investigation.

Kenneth Estes, 54, of Crooked Creek Road, Irvine was indicted for possession of a controlled substance, first degree and first offense (fentanyl) and cultivate in marijuana (5 plants or more) first offense.

The indictment says that Estes was cultivating seven marijuana plants on June 4.

The investigation was conducted by Officer James Marshall.

John K. Harrison, 59, of Winchester Road, Irvine was indicted for cultivate in marijuana (5 plants or more), first offense.

The indictment states that Harrison was cultivating 17 marijuana plants on June 24.

KSP Trooper Toney Allen conducted the investi-

gation.

Stevie R. Rogers, 35, of Flinchum Ridge, Irvine was indicted for false statement/misrepresentation to receive benefits over \$100.

The indictment says that Rogers failed to report her children's father, Dustin Finley, as a member of her household between May 2014 through April 2019.

It adds that she received a total overpayment of \$20,897.00.

Sabrina O'Bryan, OIG conducted the investigation.

Criminal summons were issued for Harrison and Rogers to appear in court.

Kenny Clark, 29, of Dark Hollow Road, Irvine and Jeffery Harrison, 38, of Summa Meadow Drive, Irvine were named as co-defendants in an indictment.

Clark was charged with trafficking in a controlled substance, first degree and first offense. The indictment says on June 6, he had 18.7 grams of methamphetamine with the intent to sell.

Jeffrey Harrison was charged with trafficking in a controlled substance, first degree and second or greater offense and being a first degree persistent felony offender.

The indictment states that on June 6, Jeffrey Harrison had 18.7 grams of methamphetamine in his possession with the intent to sell. He was convicted of trafficking in a controlled substance in 2015.

The investigating officer was Officer Marshall.

An indicted person is presumed innocent until found guilty in a court of law. An indictment only means there is evidence present which may convict the person.

## Police activity report

**Daniel Bowling**, 48, address unknown, was arrested Sept. 10 by Irvine Police Chief John Sturniolo. The chief said Bowling was located across the street from a daycare center.

The citation states that a PBT test showed the presence of alcohol. The chief said Bowling had multiple syringes and a meth pipe in his pockets and backpack.

Bowling was charged with alcohol intoxication in a public place and drug paraphernalia - buy/possess.

Officer Marshall served an indictment warrant Sept. 10 on **Kenny Dale Clark**, 29, of Stacy Lane, Irvine. which charges him with trafficking in a controlled substance, first degree and first offense (methamphetamine).

Johnson was indicted on three counts of trafficking in a controlled substance, first degree (carfentanil or fentanyl derivatives, cocaine, or methamphetamine) and drug paraphernalia - buy/possess.

Officer Marshall served an indictment warrant on **Vanessa Jones**, 43, of Crabtree Lane, Irvine on Sept. 10.

Jones was indicted for possession of a controlled substance, first degree

and first offense (methamphetamine), possession of a controlled substance, third degree, and drug paraphernalia - buy/possess.

**Larry Hall**, 29, of Ruby Lane, Irvine was charged Sept. 12 with assault fourth degree (domestic third or more offense within five years) and violation of a court order.

Deputy Chris Coffey responded to a fight in progress. He had injuries to his face as well as the victim, his sister's boyfriend.

A witness said they heard Hall yelling and then saw him attacking the victim. He also struck his sister in the back of the head. KSP Post 7 reportedly told the deputy that Hall was in violation of a court order.

Deputy Brad Smith cited **Daniel W. Riddell**, 44, of Steveland Court, Irvine with theft by unlawful taking or disposition -- all others on Sept. 13.

Smith said he was dispatched to Save-A-Lot. The manager had followed the alleged shoplifter up to Stacy Lane Road.

Smith said he confronted the male, who had taken three packs of T-bone steaks valued at around \$50.

## Deputy arrests two for stealing a truck

A truck was stolen Saturday across from the AT&T on Richmond Road, but it was recovered less than an hour later by Deputy Chris Coffey.

A caller said the truck was being pulled behind a black Suburban traveling towards Richmond.

While attempting to find the vehicle, Coffey was notified that a black vehicle had taken a truck down Walnut Grove Road, off Richmond Road.

The deputy said they located both vehicles and a dolly used to pull the stolen truck at 192 Walnut Grove.

He added the motor of the Suburban was still hot. No one was around except a female inside the residence. She told the deputy she didn't know about it.

Coffey added that two men came out of the

woods toward him and Irvine Officers Stewart Morris and James Marshall.

The citation states that Douglas Harrison said he was helping the other man, Travis Cooper, take the truck because he thought Cooper had bought it.

Cooper told the officers that he had bought the truck, but the owners showed up and stated otherwise, according to Coffey.

Coffey said that during the haul to Walnut Grove, the passenger front tire blew and shredded the tire.

Coffey charged Harrison, 44, of Sarvice Hollow Road, Irvine and Cooper, 24, of Short Street, Irvine with theft or disposition of an auto, \$500 or more but under \$10,000 and criminal mischief third degree.
