Two homes burn early Sunday on Broadway

A fire that occurred during the early morning hours on January 24th has left six people without homes.

According to Irvine Fire Chief Justin Patrick the first call came in at approximately 2 a.m. for a house fire located at 277 Broadway, home of Kathy

Harrison. The fire quickly spread to the house located at 275 Broadway, owned by Hoy and Teresa Thacker.

Patrick said that Ravenna, Hargett, and the Estill County Fire Department assisted the Irvine Fire Department in putting out the fires, but both homes received severe damages.
