

One arrested early Monday for shooting

He added that Marcum started fighting with him. He said Marcum also sucker punched him, and he punched Marcum back.

According to Turner, Marcum ran back inside his house while he ran back to his vehicle.

The citation states that Turner was in a truck with two other people. Charles Mason was driving, and Ryan Cox was sitting in the middle seat. Turner was sitting on the passenger side of the truck.

Turner said that Marcum came up to the truck and fired a shot over the driver and middle seat passenger. He added the shot that was fired from the pistol hit him in the leg.

Turner left the scene and had Mason to drive him to the hospital.

The nurse told the officers that Turner's femur was broken, and the bullet came out the other side of his leg.

Turner said the gun was black, and he thought it was a 9 mm.

Turner was transferred to UK Hospital to be treated for his gunshot wound.

According to the citation, Marcum said he told Turner to not be back at his house after he came beating on his door. Marcum stated that he grabbed Turner and threw him on the ground.

Marcum reportedly said he went into his house and retrieved his pistol. He walked out to where Turner was and shot through the vehicle. He was not sure if he had hit Turner or not.

A search warrant for Marcum's residence at 275 Marcum Road was prepared by the county attorney and was served Monday morning.

Deputy Shackelford reports that a handgun was discovered. A shell casing was discovered outside behind Marcum's vehicle. Both items were retrieved for evidence.

Marcum, 57, was charged with first degree assault, second degree wanton endangerment, and possession of a firearm by a convicted felon.

The two Irvine officers assisted the

sheriff's department in serving the search warrant at Marcum's residence.

Sheriff Chris Flynn said he located a large quantity of suspected controlled substances at Marcum's residence while serving the search warrant.

He said he located a small plastic bag containing a brown substance on an end table in the living room. It field tested positive for fentanyl.

Flynn said he found a black purse in a back bedroom of the house. Inside the purse was a plastic bag containing approximately 32 grams of a brown powdery substance, consistent with the substance, located in the living room.

The sheriff also reports that he found a small plastic bag containing approximately 3 grams of a brown powdery substance, another small plastic bag containing approximately 3 grams of a gray powdery substance, and a small plastic bag containing 13 grams of a white crystal like substance, suspected to be methamphetamine.

Flynn stated there were approxi-

mately 17 xanax bars inside a blue pill bottle. There were another three xanax bars inside a cigarette cellophane wrapper.

The citation states that inside the purse was \$6,247.96 in cash and coins.

The officers also report finding a set of digital scales and multiple packages of small plastic bags.

Marcum and the woman at the house, Deanna Leaf, 56, of Foxtown Road, McKee were each charged with aggravated trafficking in a controlled substance, greater than or equal to 28 grams (fentanyl), trafficking in a controlled substance, first degree and first offense, greater than or equal to 2 grams (methamphetamine), trafficking in a controlled substance, third degree and first offense, greater than 20 but less than 120 dosage units (drug unspecified), and drug paraphernalia - buy/possess.

After their arrests, Marcum and Leaf were lodged in the Three Forks Regional Jail in Beattyville.

Irvine Police Dept. Activity

A North Irvine resident was arrested early Saturday morning after a female claimed that he had strangled her.

The Irvine Police Department received a complaint from Estill County 911 system to respond to 1003 Winchester Road for an assault.

Officer Stuart Morris responded to the address and took a statement from the victim. She stated that she had been in an altercation with the male.

She further stated that he put his hands around her neck and pinned her to the drivers side door of her truck. Then she said he strangled her until she lost consciousness.

The citation states the window visor was broken as a result of the altercation.

The officer said photographs were taken of the victim's neck which was red on both sides.

Two additional witnesses to the altercation were identified and their statements were taken.

The victim went to Marcum & Wallace Memorial Hospital to be treated for her injuries.

Barry Crouch, 43, of John Rawlins Road, Irvine was located at his residence where he was charged with first degree strangulation and third degree criminal mischief.

Officer James Marshall assisted with the investigation.

Orville S. Richardson,

37, of Flint Road, Waco, was arrested March 23 by Officer Jason Conrad.

Richardson was charged with public intoxication of a controlled substance (excludes alcohol) and third degree criminal trespassing on March 23.

The officer had been dispatched to 529 Cantrill Street in reference to a male trespasser.

When the homeowner made contact, the male ran from the homeowner. The homeowner and a neighbor chased after the alleged trespasser and caught him in a neighboring backyard on Broadway Street. They detained Richardson until Officer Jason Conrad arrived on the scene.

Richardson reportedly told the officer that he was hiding from someone, and he did not know anyone who lived in that area.

The officer said that Richardson kept repeating himself, was sweating profusely, and had slurred speech. Officer Conrad said he located a spoon and uncapped syringe in the man's back pocket.

Officer Jason Conrad served two Estill County warrants on **James R. Collins**, 39, of Rockaway Road, Irvine on March 24.

One of the warrants was for failure to appear. The other was for non-payment of court costs, fees, or fines.

A Madison County

warrant was served on **Donna Cockrell**, 32, of Richmond on March 25 by Officer Russell Morris. The warrant was for failure to appear. The arrest was made on Cantrill Street, Irvine.

The same officer served an Estill County warrant on **Brian A. Tipton**, 31, of James Street, Irvine on March 24. The warrant was for failure to appear.

Officer James Marshall arrested **Byron K. Wathen**, 45, of Beattyville on March 28 on a Powell County warrant. The warrant charged Wathen with probation violation (for a felony offense). The arrest was made on Rich-

mond Road, Irvine.

Officer Stuart Morris charged **Daniel Riddell**, 42, of Steveland Court with public intoxication of a controlled substance (excludes alcohol) on March 27.

IPD received a complaint about a possibly intoxicated male at the end of Wall Street. When the officer arrived, he located Riddell.

He said Riddell could not hold still, and his body movement was extremely exaggerated.

Officer Morris also served two Estill County bench warrants on Riddell for failure to appear.

Mikal L. Adams, 21,

of N. Plum Street, Irvine faces nine traffic-related charges after his vehicle was stopped by Officer Jason Conrad on March 17.

The officer said he observed Adams fail to stop at a stop sign at the intersection of N. Plum Street and Broadway. He said the moped was all over the road and driver failed to use a turn signal when turning left onto Cherry Street.

The driver told the officer that he did not need a license to drive a moped. Marshall said the moped did not have any head lamps and no other working lights.

Conrad administered

field sobriety tests. Adams told him that he had smoked marijuana about two hours prior to the traffic stop.

After his arrest, Conrad transported Adams to Marcum & Wallace Hospital where he refused a blood draw.

Adams was charged with disregarding stop sign, failure to or improper signal, failure to illuminate head lamps, no registration plates, no registration receipt, no operators-moped license, failure of owner to maintain required insurance, improper equipment, and operating a motor vehicle under the influence.
