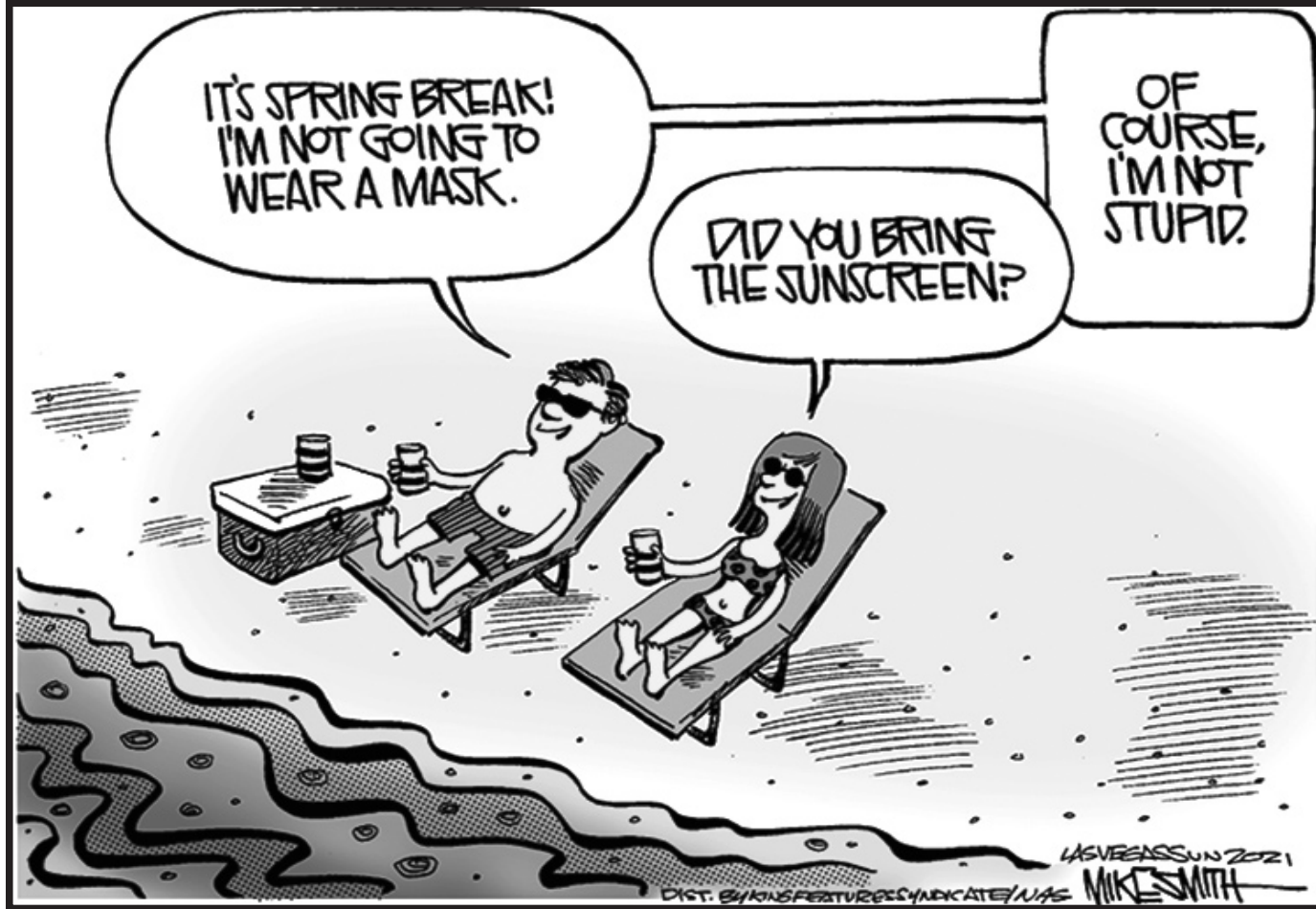
"Sounds like you're bitter because she changed you so drastically," remarks his friend.

Library Corner

Adult Services

Hello Readers! It's a great time to visit the library. We are doing limited in-person services and we have some new technology at the library that is available to our patrons and community.

We were selected to participate in the Community Connect: Digital Access at Home, an initiative of the American Library Association (ALA) and Capital one that offers cash grants to help rural libraries offer internet access and financial education for patrons.

We currently have five Verizon Wi-Fi hotspots available for check-out for two weeks with one renewal, as long as there are no pending holds. The mobile hotspots circulate only to registered patrons who are 18 years of age or older, who are in good standing, and whose records include current address, phone, and email information. The patron must show their library card and photo identification before checking out a hotspot kit. We do have a circulation policy and user agreement for the patron to read over and sign before checking out the hotspot kit. We are proud to offer this service to our community along with new programming for those interested in learning more about online banking and banking security.

We have also obtained a Library Services and Technology Act Grant from Kentucky Department for Libraries and Archives (KDLA) to focus on workforce-related educational, instructional, or outreach services. We will be using this grant to create a Wi-Fi hotspot and laptop lending program with the primary goal of assisting adult patrons with workforce-related needs. This grant with KDLA provided the library with five Dell Latitude laptops, equipped with Windows 10 operating system, Microsoft Home and Business 2019, which includes Word, Excel, PowerPoint, and Outlook. The grant also included funding for additional software for each laptop and five additional hotspots with data service. We will be working on implementing programs that will build resume writing skills, job skills, and interview skills. The Digital Toolbox includes the laptop and Appalachian Wire-

less MiFi Hotspot, along with a mouse and a travel case for the laptop. Patrons who borrow a digital toolbox must agree to the terms and conditions of the lending agreement before checking-out the toolbox. The digital toolbox kit checks out for a period of 4 weeks and is limited to one per household. Once again patrons must be 18 or older to check-out the toolbox and must have a library card in good standing.

As the Adult Services Librarian at the library I'm super excited about getting these devices into the hands of those patrons who have limited or no internet. I look forward to the day that we can open our doors and offer in-person programs and I can work one-on-one with those needing resume help or help with a job application. I also would like to mention that on April 9 at 10:00 A.M. there will be an Introduction to Online Banking program with our partners with the Kentucky Department of Financial Institutions. The topics include: An Overview of Online Banking, Mobile Banking, and Safety & Security. You can register for this program by going to our Facebook page or giving me a call at 606-723-6730. Also on April 12 from 10 a.m. -3 p.m. the library is partnering up with the Kentucky Career Center to host a Take-Home Job Fair, so stop by the library and pick up a bag of information. We have several companies looking to hire and we will be handing out information on these companies. Follow us on Facebook and Twitter for updates on all of our library happenings.
