School construction nears end; board accepts \$11.8 million bid

Construction updates were provided to school board members on Thursday night by Peter Fisher and Jeremy Faulkner. Faulkner said that that technology center was nearing the final stages of completion with flooring being installed and inspections being done. He said they were right on track with their completion date and everything would be ready for the ribbon cutting ceremony scheduled for July 23rd. Superintendent Jeff Saylor said that many elected officials planned to be at the ceremony including Governor Andy Beshear.
