



The term "Word" is from Savar, meaning "a thing said." Then Logos stresses "the thought of mind" from the speaker. Then Rhema, "the expression." But, the choice, is often one of the "emphases" rather than the meaning.

Logos is used of Jesus as the Revelation of God in John 1:1. He is noted as supreme and definitive before he came into the world. In **John 1:14**, "And the Word was made flesh, and dwelt among us ..." Before his coming, the Word was revealed through the

So today, all who attempt to teach or preach should take heed unto Paul's admonition to 2 Timothy 4:2-5, "Preach the word; be instant in season, out of season; reprove, rebuke, exhort with all longsuffering and doctrine. 3For the time will come when they will not endure sound doctrine; but after their own lusts shall they heap to themselves teachers, having itching ears; 4And they shall turn away their ears from the truth, and shall be turned unto fables. 5But watch thou in all things, endure afflictions, do the work of an evangelist, make full proof of thy ministry." Closing, in **1 John 2:5**, it is written, "But whoso keepeth his word, in him verily is the love of God per*fected: hereby know we that we are in him.*" I hope you are one of them.
