## Fiscal Court Met Monday

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David Brown Kinloch invited the fiscal court and public to a dedication ceremony at Lock 12 Hydro Electric Plant on Sept. 21, 3-5 p.m.

Kinloch said the power plant is open now and they are selling electricity to Jackson Energy Cooperative for 6% under wholesale price.

His company partners with Berea College. The county will be entering into an agreement for a public park at the dam area. The county will be paid for maintaining the park.

"It's been off limits to the public for years," Kinloch stated.

Once the park opens, there will be fishing, canoeing, and picnicking.

Kinloch said the beach area belongs to the golf course.

Zach Horch, owner of Asbury Sports Turf, explained bids his company had submitted for two ball fields at the Kentucky River Park.

State Representative Bill Wesley visited the court meeting. He said that funding was down for road projects this year, but he was supporting the four priority roads the fiscal court had recommended.

Freida Blackwell was appointed as a library board member.

The court discussed deleting an unused portion of McDowell Cemetery Road from the county road system.

Watson said it will not affect the road now used as McDowell Cemetery Road from White Oak Road to the cemetery.

Sheriff Chris Flynn reported that his de-

partment received \$16,670.75 from two drug cases. He explained that his office uses those funds to purchase needed equipment.

Lucas Barnes, assistant director of Estill Emergency Management Agency, stated the safe room for 911 is expected to be completed at the end of September.

He said the annual CSEPP exercise with other counties will be held on Sept. 15. With the covid crisis, he added that schools and the hospital will not be involved.

Fire chief Derrick Muncie said the county fire department has made 256 runs this year and now has 24 hour coverage.

Solid waste coordinator Chad Smith stated the county has gotten rid of 1,200 tires but still have another 800 to dispose of.

The county will have a waste tire collection in October for residents and not businesses.

Watson announced the county has received \$200,000 for utility payments for those who are behind. Those funds will be administered by Kentucky River Foothills.

The circuit and district judges are expected to move into the bank building on Sept. 1. Teddy Hunt was paid \$3,904 for carpentry work to get the offices ready.

Sheriff Flynn will be using the drive-through this fall to collect property taxes.

## Estill Co. students are quarantined

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Neighboring Lee County was not in the red last week, but had an increase of cases at the end of the week. Their students had been in school only two days but that school system decided to take the first three days of this week off.

The Estill County Health Department is giving free vaccinations Monday, Wednesday, and Thursday from 1 to 4 p.m.

and Tuesday and Friday from 8-12 noon. No appointment is necessary.

Walling said the health department is giving all three types of vaccinations: Johnson & Johnson, Moderna, and Pfizer.

Johnson and Johnson does not require a second shot at this time. Pfizer is the only vaccine approved for youth ages 12-18. There is no vaccine approved for children under 12.
