
#### **Bible Word Search Answer on Page 12**



# Is our life making a difference within the lives of others?

Written in **Philippians 1:26-26**, we find this information. Paul writes, saying, "For to me to live is Christ, and to die is gain. <sup>22</sup>But if I live in the flesh, this is the fruit of my labour: yet what I shall choose I wot not. <sup>23</sup>For I am in a strait betwixt two, having a desire to depart, and to be with Christ; which is far better: <sup>24</sup>Nevertheless to abide in the flesh is more needful for <u>vou</u>. <sup>25</sup>And having this confidence, I know that I shall abide and continue with you all for your furtherance of us." and joy of faith; <sup>26</sup>That your rejoicing may be more

Here in this passage of Scripture is imposed a question for every Christian, "to abide in the flesh is more needful for you." Verse 24

During the Mid-70's, I sat in a series of Bible lessons to try to tell brethren, "How can I make my life more effective for Christ?" I still remember many points of those sermons. But, when I consider for myself and over fifty years of attempted teachings. of Christian virtues, I ask myself, "Has your life made any difference within the lives of others?"

"My prayers is that, 'yes, I have," and how can I know this? By the lives of those who obeyed the Gospel and were baptized for the remission of their sins and are presently still living faithful to the confession of their faith that Jesus Christ is the Son of God and the only Saviour of mankind. Acts 4:12 says so.

Paul in **2 Corinthians 3:2-3**, said to the Corinthian church, "Ye are our epistle written in our hearts, known and read of all men: 3Forasmuch as ye are manifestly declared to be the epistle of Christ ministered by us, written not with ink, but with the Spirit of the living God; not in tables of stone, but in fleshy tables of the heart."

So, Paul says that those of Corinth that were still obedient Christians were his continual witnesses to his work. Then, he went further to say in 2 Corinthians 4:5-7, "For we preach not ourselves, but Christ Jesus the Lord; and ourselves your servants for Jesus' sake. <sup>6</sup>For God, who commanded the light to shine out of darkness, hath shined in our hearts, to give the light of the knowledge of the glory of God in the face of Jesus Christ. <sup>7</sup>But we have this treasure in earthen vessels, that the excellency of the power may be of God, and not

Sadly, I sat in a funeral service one day and heard abundant in Jesus Christ for me by my coming to you a man say more than once, "I can't wait to die." I pondered this for some time; this man claimed to be a preacher. But how sad it still is, that this man did not believe the plan God gave to save men; still, he said, "I can't wait to die." Let me repeat this: no man should pray to die; and especially if he is a preacher. Paul knew the danger that he was facing, but he persisted in the work of preaching the Gospel that others might hear it and obey it.
