"The key to breast cancer detection is early detection,"

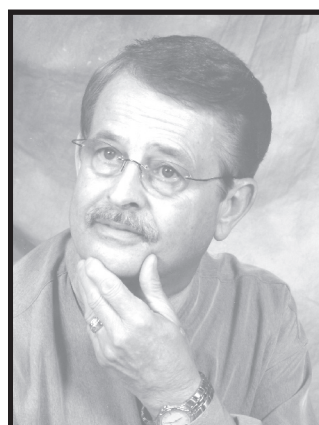
said Sharon Whitaker, Marcum & Wallace Hospital Director of Radiology. "It is so important for women to get annual mammograms and be proactive about their health."
