(If you can find pawpaws) 1 cup of pawpaw pulp

with all seeds removed 1 tsp. baking powder ¹/₂ cup melted butter 1 tsp. ginger (optional) 3 eggs $\frac{1}{2}$ teaspoon salt 1 teaspoon baking soda $2\frac{1}{2}$ tsps. cinnamon

During the worst days during the war in Vietnam, Bill Gaither and his wife wrote a song, entitled: "Jesus Is Coming Soon." Today, I want to call your attention to some things he said in this song. Verse One, "Troublesome times are here." I don't know anything about the Gaither religious beliefs or practices, so I wonder where he got this idea. Maybe, it was because of the war, but including, I would like to think that he arrived at his decision by reading from **II Timothy 3**, where it says: "This know also, that in the last days perilous times shall come." The last day spoken of here is not in agreement with the terms elsewhere. In Acts 2:17 it means all the days from Pentecost until Jesus returns. Then in James 5:3, it has reference to the period preceding the Roman overthrow of Jerusalem. Then in **I Peter 15**, this term is speaking of the time of the Lord's return to judge the word.

But, take notice! The term last days in II Timothy 3:1 is referring to the closing of the door upon this present time.

So when Bill Gaither wrote, "Troublesome times are here," he is speaking at presently, and they are perilous. So now, we know where he was reading from. He goes on to say: "Filling men's hearts with fear." The world for the most part are afraid of each other. Mistrust is abundant. The writer, Jude, knew something about this time. He wrote that many were feeding themselves without fear. So fear is all about us because the lack of spiritual devotion is absent in many places. Then he said in this song: "Freedom we well hold dear now is at stake." Who would have ever imagined that we would have become a second status nation. Who would think that supposedly brilliant educated men sitting on the Supreme Court would rule that homesexualism and lesbianism was the right of civility. What about our Creator? Does He have any rights? When said that all who practice such would spend eternity in the fire of hell, this includes the members of the Supreme Court as well. This has far reaching consequences. Even now there are some calling for a review panel where a preacher's sermon would have to pass this review board, so that any mention of homosexuality would be removed, and even the churches could be sued for allowing it. Then he goes on to say, "Humbling your heart to God will save from the chastening rod." Perhaps, Bill was thinking about **I Corinthians 6:9-11** where Paul says that all types of these people will not see the kingdom of God. I believe Mr. Gaither perhaps read <u>Matthew 7:13-14</u>, "*Enter ye in at the strait gate for wide* is the gate and broad is the way that leadeth to destruction and many therebe which go in thereat. Because straight is the gate, narrow is the way, which leadeth unto life, and few there be which find it." Do you believe that we are living near to the day when our Lord's return? Watching a child take his or her first steps is a marvelous sight to behold. Pictures are taken, memories created and lives changed.




