Everyone who had a Model-T needed to carry a repair kit that included pliers, hay-baling wire, a jack, air pump, patches and glue. Flat tires were repaired on the spot; they were plentiful due to horseshoe nails on the road. Tires had rubber inner tubes which were scratched to roughen surface around the hole. Glue was placed on the tube and then the patch was applied. It was necessary to wait so for the patch to dry. 
