Two indicted for selling drugs 11 others are indicted on various, other offenses

Two defendants were indicted Friday by the Estill County Grand Jury for trafficking in controlled substances. Two others were indicted for possession of controlled substances.

Samuel D. Gollihue, 36, of Main Street, Irvine was indicted on a single count of trafficking in a controlled substance, first degree and first offense.

The indictment states that on August 12, 2015, Gollihue sold 1 and 1/2 hydrocodone pills.

Irvine Police Chief Brad Smith was the investigating officer.

Avonna Kay Cox, 41, of Thomas Road, Irvine was indicted on two counts of complicity to traffic in a controlled substance, second degree and first offense, and two counts of trafficking in legend drugs, first offense.

According to the indictment, Cox sold 25 clonazepam and three buprenorphin on May 25, 2015. Those are first degree controlled substances.

On the same day she allegedly sold one gabapentin and three promethazine, which are classified as legend drugs.

The co-defendant with Cox was not identified in the indictment.

The investigation was conducted by Irvine Officer John Sturniolo.

Farrell Marcum, 51, of Marcum Road, Irvine, was indicted for alcohol intoxication in a public place (1st and 2nd offense) and possession of a controlled substance, first degree and first offense.

The indictment says that Marcum was found passed out October 4, 2015, behind the wheel of an automobile. It adds that Marcum had in his possession one 30 mg. oxycodone pill.

Deputy Sheriff Randy Farthing was the investigat-

ing officer.

Gregory Scott Arvin, 46, of Beattyville, was indicted for operating a motor vehicle under the influence of alcohol/drugs, first offense, possession of a controlled substance, first degree and first offense, and drug paraphernalia - buy/possess.

A traffic stop was made on Arvin's vehicle on August 14, 2015 by Irvine Officer John Sturniolo. The officer reported that Arvin possessed four percocet, cut straws and rolling papers intended for use with illegal drugs.

Leandrea L. Perkins, 32, of Richmond was indicted for theft or disposition of a

firearm.

According to the indictment, Perkins pawned a gun on October 5, 2015 which had been reported stolen by Zack Warner.

The investigation was conducted by Deputy Russell Morris.

Elise Fauste, 59, of Louise Court, Irvine was named in a nine count indictment. All nine charges are criminal possession of a forged instrument, second degree.

The indictment says that between August 2, 2015 and September 15, 2015, Fauste cashed nine checks on the account of Millard Dixon Jr. The checks totaled \$814.23.

Council discusses road construction to widen N. Main Street to Bypass

The Irvine Council discussed plans for the widening of Winchester Road from North Main to the Bypass at Monday's Council meeting.

Council members remain vague about the project planned by the state highway department.

Police Chief Brad Smith said when completed, it should have a center lane for left turns similar to the one on Richmond Road.

Councilmember Tim Burkhardt said he

heard that the exit to Geneva Avenue will be shifted over a little.

Another councilman, Tobo Bryant, said he heard there would be safer exits for Geneva Avenue and Rice Street. He added the plans are also to correct a water issue at Estill Springs.

Bryant suggested the council get maps from the state to see what the exact plans were.

Student Who Made "Hit List" Is No Longer at Estill High

A student is no longer attending classes at Estill County High School after a notebook with a hit list was found on the floor of a classroom last Tuesday.

James Gross, the school resource officer, notified administrative staff of the notebook around 12:15 p.m. last Tuesday. Letters were sent home to parents that afternoon.

The letter from Supt. Jeff Saylor says the words, "Hit List," were written at the top of the page.

The list contained the names of several students. This past Monday, Saylor said the parents of all students whose names appeared on the list were called by the school resource officer.

The superintendent stated the school has followed the disciplinary action toward the student based upon Board and School Based Decision Making Policy and Procedures.

Saylor said future placement of the student in school will be determined at a later date. The matter is also being dealt with through local law enforcement, the District Attorney, and the Court Designated Worker (for juveniles).

Saylor stated that at no time were any students in danger. The student is assumed to be a juvenile, and his or her name, age, and grade of school are confidential.
