## Paper Dolls

I remember when I was a child I loved playing with paper dolls. They were great to play with during the winter on days we were out of school or simply as a pastime. I loved playing with them anytime.

Every Saturday I would scamper down to the 5 and 10 Cent Store with my allowance of a quarter knotted into a handkerchief to pick through and choose a paper-doll book. There were several to choose from; mostly movie star books that were very popular. Each book had one or more dolls, and pages and pages of ball gowns, hats, play clothes, furs and jewelry. The books often contained costumes from current movies and plays.

Usually at Christmas or a birthday I would receive new paper dolls. They were a great gift to receive when drawing names at Christmas in school. I would also cut pictures of clothes from an old Alden's or Sears catalog and make models from cardboard if I did not have store bought ones. I even designed outfits and cut them out of construction paper at times. They were a great way to encourage creativity.

I remember my favorite paper doll was Debbie Reynolds. She was a beautiful movie star in the 50s and 60s, (And still is). I also liked Shirley Temple and the Lennon Sisters who sang on the Lawrence Welk Show every week.

Actually, in America, paper dolls have been available since the 1820s. Some women's magazines carried dolls each month; paper Betsy McCall appeared in that magazine in the 1950s and even later. Even Sunday comics often included dolls and their clothes to cut out.

Paper dolls reached their peak in the 1940s to late 50s with thousands of paper doll books sold each year. However, the arrival of the Barbie doll in the 1960s hurt their popularity. Girls suddenly had a 3D, full-figured doll with a huge wardrobe and accessories and even a boyfriend named Ken!

A few paper dolls are still produced. Some are reprints from the past, and others are the work of talented new artists. I know of at least four books featuring First Lady Michelle Obama, with the gowns she wore to the inauguration and other occasions.

Paper dolls are extremely collectible these days. Because so many of them were played to death, and then discarded, many of the old sets that still survive are very desirable and expensive, especially those featuring movie stars. Sets that originally sold for a dime or 15 cents are now worth \$100 and more.

You might find vintage paper dolls at a flea market or garage sale and there are some on eBay. Wish I could find a Debbie Reynolds set.

Most collectors just buy paper dolls for their own pleasure. People like to share sets from when they were little girls with their granddaughters or nieces. I'm out of luck there, I only have boys.

James wrote, "Is any one of you sick? He should call the elders of the church to pray over him and anoint him with oil in the name of the Lord!"

God's power to heal has an important place in Scripture. In fact, of the 1,257 narrative verses in the four Gospels, 484 are related specifically to healing. We believe in God's healing power and know He can heal. David also believed in God's healing power and believed that God could heal him. But where did David begin in his plea for God's help?

David was hanging on to life by a thread. He felt total rejection by God because of a major sin he had committed. It had become a burden that was too heavy to bear, too big to overlook and too obvious to ignore. In fact he said that God "pierced him and His hand came down hard upon him." He knew he was being punished by God for sinning against God.

After thoroughly describing his mental, physical and spiritual sicknesses he cried out, "I confess my iniquity; I am troubled by my sin." In his wisdom and from his former relationship with God, he realized that God would not bring about physical and mental healing unless David first confessed his need for spiritual healing.

There can be little doubt that sin and physical and mental illnesses are intimately connected. Yet, many only want God's physical and mental healing. With God, all healing begins with confession and repentance.
