

# Irvine Police Log

Loretta Turner, 36, Richmond was arrested Nov. 16 on Broadway/High Street by Officer John Sturniolo for alcohol intoxication and disorderly conduct. Citation states that she went to 234 High Street and began yelling and using foul language at homeowner.

A fugitive warrant signed by Madison District Court B. Brown was also served on Turner. The warrant says that Turner failed to appear on charges of failure to wear seat belts, no registration receipt, operating on suspended or revoked operator license, improper or no windshield, possession of open alcoholic beverage container in motor vehicle, failure to notify address change to Dept. of Transportation, operating motor vehicle under influence of alcohol/drugs, and contempt of court. Bail on the fugitive warrant was set at \$1,000 cash.

\* Jacquyn Brooke Lee, 22, Lexington was arrested Nov. 22 by Officer Sturniolo at River Drive/Rosebud. She was charged with driving under the influence of drugs, speeding 25 mph over limit, possession of a controlled substance (suboxone), and possession of drug paraphernalia.

The officer said she was observed driving 60 mph on River Drive in a 35 mph zone. He added that she failed field sobriety tests. The K-9 unit (Fritz) alerted on the vehicle. Dozens of vehicle, crack cocaine pipes, marijuana pipes, razor blade and assorted paraphernalia were found, the officer stated.

Sturniolo said the suboxone was located in the woman's wallet.

\* Victoria E. Neal, 32, of Chestnut Street, Irvine was arrested Nov. 20 by Officer Sturniolo. She was charged with careless driving, failure to use turn signal, driving under the influence of drugs, and possession of marijuana.

He said that she was observed at stop sign at intersection of Main and Orchard Streets and did not use a turn signal. He added that she began to drive in reverse towards him. He said she failed field sobriety tests and stated that an hour earlier she had taken suboxone.

The K-9 unit (Fritz) alerted on the vehicle. The officer said he found two marijuana cigarettes in the glove compartment.

\* Donald Fields, 54, of Sugar Hollow Road, Irvine was arrested Nov. 18 by Officer Sturniolo at Shell Mart for alcohol intoxication, disorderly conduct, second, and criminal mischief.

The citation states that Fields threw garbage around property at 112 Main Street and removed decorations. He then traveled to Shell Mart where he knocked over garbage cans and yelled and cursed at patrons and employees.

Sturniolo said the man told him he had drunk all the alcoholic beverages he could drink.

\* Michael D. Bishop, 41, of Wall Street, Irvine was arrested for alcohol intoxication on Nov. 18 by Irvine Chief Brad Smith.

The citation states that Smith received several calls about Bishop stumbling back and forth on River Drive. Smith said that Bishop had a strong odor of alcohol about him. The chief said he had to physically hold Bishop to keep him from falling.

\* Timothy Hall, 51, a homeless man from Winchester, Ky. was arrested by Officer Sturniolo on Nov. 17 for alcohol intoxication,

disorderly conduct second and menacing.

The citation states the man was at Marcum & Wallace Hospital where he yelled and cursed at nurses and a security guard. He put his hands in a nurse's face which caused her to fear for assault.

The officer said the man smelled of alcohol and failed field sobriety tests.

\* A parole violation warrant from the Kentucky Departments of Corrections was served on Jessica Louise Rose by Officer Sturniolo on Nov. 16. It states that Rose, 32, of North Plum Street, Irvine, has violated the terms of her parole.

The parole board says that Rose was convicted of possession of a controlled substance, first degree, first offense and promoting contraband in Estill County. She was paroled on Nov. 28, 2012.

The warrant states that Rose has absconded parole supervision and failed to report to her parole officer as directed.

A bench warrant from Estill District Judge William Leach was also served on Rose. It says she was found guilty of public intoxication on Aug. 13, 2014 and failed to pay \$178 in fine and court costs.

\* Three bench warrants were served by Officer Sturniolo on Jessica Turner,

36, who gave addresses of Coal Wash Road, Irvine and Poplar Street, Ravenna. All three warrants were issued by Judge William Leach from Estill District Court.

Two of the warrants were issued for the same court case. Turner was charged with public intoxication, promoting contraband, and menacing. The warrants were issued because Turner failed to appear for a pre-trial conference and failure to comply with West Care. No bond was to be given on those two warrants.

The third arrest warrant

was for a traffic related charge. On December 1, 2014, Turner was found guilty of illegal possession of a legend drug and operating a motor vehicle under the influence of alcohol/drugs. Three other charges, speeding 15 mph over limit, no tail lamps, and possession of open alcohol container in motor vehicle, were dismissed.

The judge said that Turner had failed to pay fines of \$963 plus a \$35 fee. She could be released from custody after posting a \$963 cash bond.

The board itself was given an award by Jim McClanahan from the KSBA for having one of the most energy efficient schools in the state of Kentucky. McClanahan was pleased to announce that this was the first energy star award that Estill County has ever received and that it something that is very hard to achieve. He added that the staff at West Irvine elementary as well as the students play a key role in achieving the award and suggested that

West Irvine hold an assembly to get the students more engaged.

Roland Mueller updated the board on the renovations that are taking place at the high school and South Irvine. He said that progress at the high school has taken a little time but the contractors have done a good job. He said that the bleachers were installed in the gymnasium last week at the high school and that construction at South Irvine should be completed by the end of the month. He asked the board to approve a change order for the South Irvine project that would add extra days to their original contract due to

the inclement weather back in June causing delays on the project.

Mr. Saylor informed the board that he was working on a budget report that would be given to them at each meeting. He said that he hoped to have that ready for them by the meeting in December. He also said that he had done a walk through of all the schools and found a lot of good in each one. He said that a meeting has been scheduled for December 10th for all principals from each school to meet and discuss things that are happening at each school.

are all the Engineers," added Saylor.

Starting in January, Saylor said that the board will partner with a local business to recognize one certified employee as well as one classified employee each month. He said that a criteria is being put together and each principal will make recommendations for employee of the month based on that criteria.

A luncheon will be held on December 14th for new employees of the school district.
