## Say It How!

I realize that the things that I will write about today will not be popular or well received by those who read it, but preachers are required by the Lord to cry aloud against any form of unrighteousness.

In an Old Testament example found in **Isaiah 58:1**, "*Cry aloud, spare not, lift up thy voice as a trumpet, and show my people their transgression, and the house of Jacob their sins.*" And in the New Testament, **II Timothy 4:1-5**, "*Having the charge from Paul, he said to Timothy; 'Preach the word, be instant in season, out of season, reprove, rebuke, with all long suffering and doctrine, for the time will come (and now is!) when they will not endure sound doctrine, but after their own desires shall they gather to themselves teachers having itching ears, and they shall turn away from the truth, and shall be turned into fiction.' Then he said: 'Watch thou in all things, do the work of the evangelist.'*"

I believe that this administration is required of every teacher, preacher today, and we should not delay for our Lord is to come again.

Sadly, just last week I met a young man who must be a studier of the Bible, because he could quote some of it. But he was a student of a TV preacher who has a powerful delivery, and stir the emotions of people, but again, I know that the man does not believe in the plan of salvation given to us in the New Testament. When I pointed the inconsistency of his preacher, he replied, "I know the Bible says that baptism is for the remission of sins." Then he said: "Lord, do not let me wait until I retire with 40 acres, cattle or a white fence. Let me preach now! And not delay."

Friend, the Bible plainly teaches us to examine ourselves whether we be in the faith. **II Corinthians 13:5** the only way that this is possible is to read the Bible and simply do what it says. this is the only safe way to live.
