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
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Maudie's Naughties

By What Authority? by BOB CASEY, preacher **Cornerstone Church of Christ Bond Street at Camp Avenue in West Irvine**

Recorded in Mark 11:15-33 is the story of our Lord when He entered into the temple, and when He went in this is what He found. A common market place, the money changers were doing their bankers' action, also some were selling doves for sacrifices to be offered. Livestock were also offered for sale. John 2:12-22 tells the same

While doing this our Lord quoted **Isaiah 56:7** saying that "My house shall be called the house of prayer, but ye have made it a den of thieves." Then for that day the Lord left, but He returned early the next morning and this is what happened. The scribes and the chief priest came to Him and said: "By what authority doest thou these things?" But our Lord also had a question for them. He asked: "The baptism of John. Was it from Heaven or from man?" If they said, "from heaven," they would have believed upon what John said, or if they said from men, they would have to denounce John as being the prophet sent from Heaven. So they lied and said: "We

So what can this story tell us today that will be helpful in striving to arrive at the right answer in matters of faith? So we need to work a little with the question: "By what authority do we point unto for things we do in wor-

(1) By what authority does the Catholic ascribe to as the supposed headship over the church? For the Bible clearly teaches that Jesus Christ alone was given that function (Ephesians 1:22-29 and Colossians 1:18).

(2) By what authority do Protestant denominations teach that salvation comes by faith only? Many of them do so. But the Bible clearly says that we are not saved by faith alone (James 2:24).

(3) By what authority in Pentecostal churches teach that we are baptized with the Holy Spirit, so that we can speak in sounds, that are unintelligent, and other revelations from God. The Bible clearly teaches that the Holy Spirit to do miracles was only promised to the apostles (Acts 1:1-6) and that this supernatural gift would cease when the perfect revelation was given (I Corinthians 13:8 and James 1:25). The Bible also says that this was given once and not thousands of times thereafter (Jude

(4) By what authority does the Christian Church use mechanical instruments of music into their worship. The New Testament is emphatic in teaching us that we are to sing (Ephesians 5:19, Colossians 3:16).


(5) By what authority do some churches of Christ build facilities called fellowship halls out of the treasury fund for dinners, games, etc. when the scriptures plainly teach that eating is to be done at home (I Corinthians <u>11:22-34</u>) and that the only activities that the church is to be engaged in is edification, benevolence, and evangelism (Ephesians 4:12).

Closing, so when churches attempt to work outside the authority of the Bible, they fail to show a proper respect of our Lord. If we continue to do things outside of authority, we jeopardize our relationship to Almighty
