## Kentucky-Louisville Game

What many Kentucky or Louisville basketball fans would like for Christmas is to have a win in Saturday's UK-Louisville game in Rupp Arena in the annual Battle of the Bluegrass. Now with the way both teams are playing, Kentucky fans have a lot more reasons to worry and Louisville fans have a lot more reason to be optimistic.

In fact, after UK's loss to Ohio State Saturday, it's easy to make a case for why Louisville should be favored — something no one would the season started.
