Twenty indictments were returned by the Estill County Grand Jury on Friday.

Jerry D. Stone, 48, Winchester, Edward Wayne Jordon, 41, Race Track Road, Irvine Irvine was indicted for two counts of sexual and Ashley Nicole Groves, 31, were named co-defendants in an indictment.


