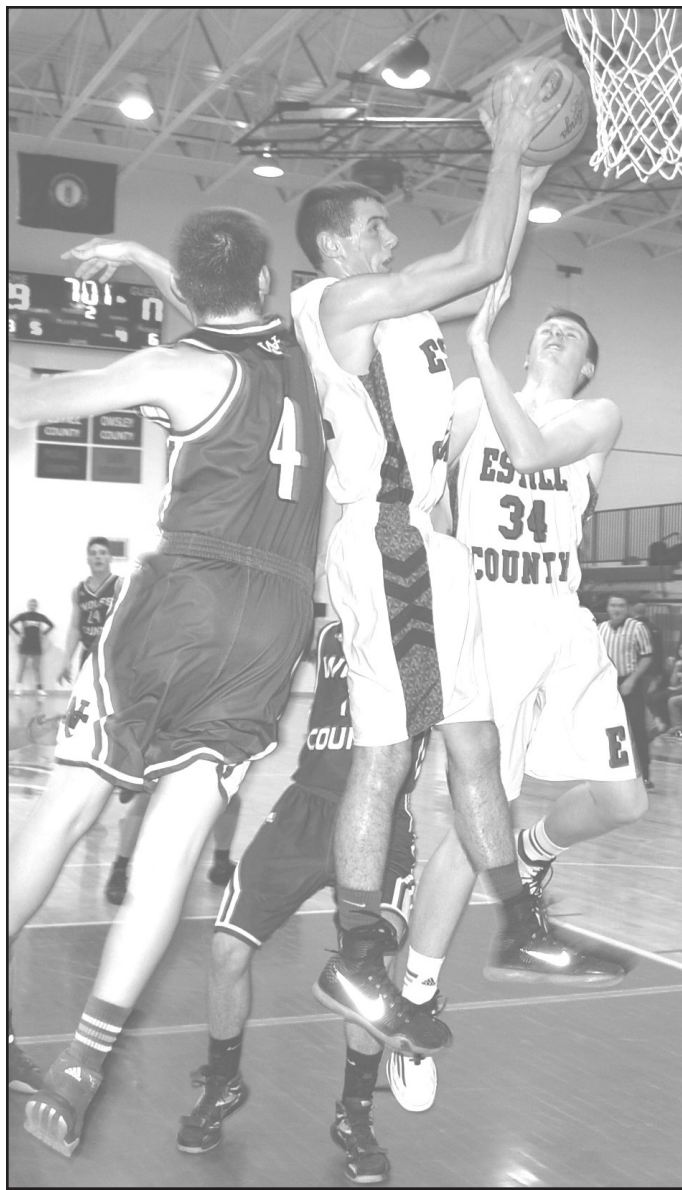
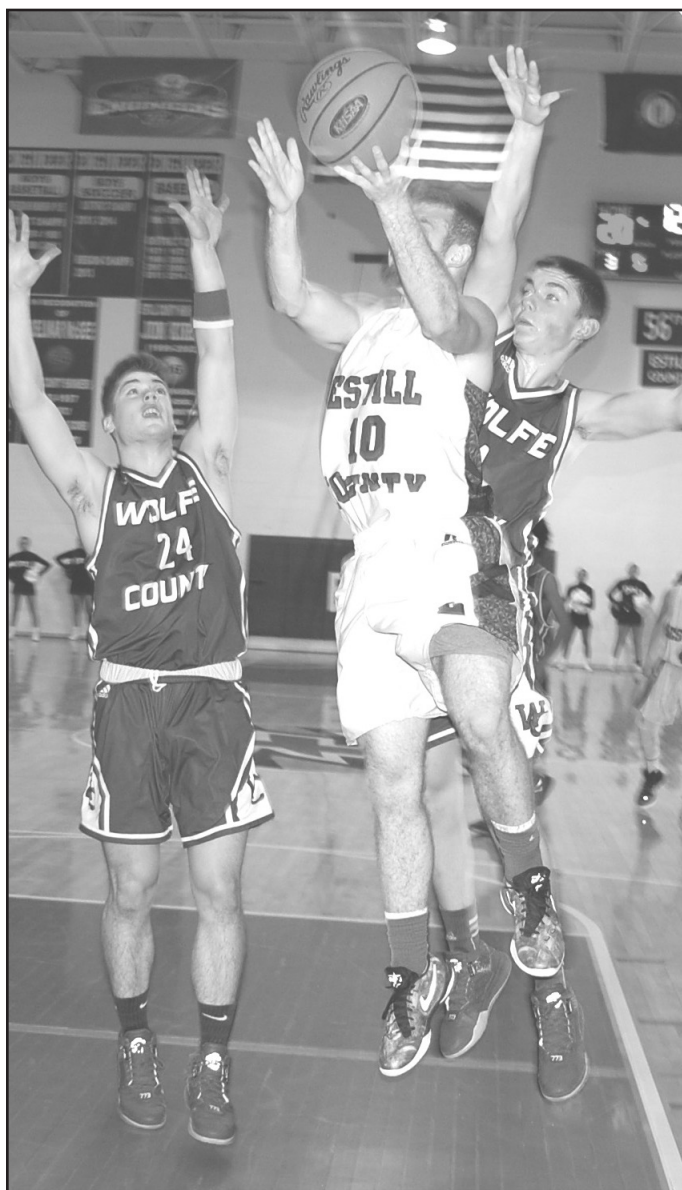




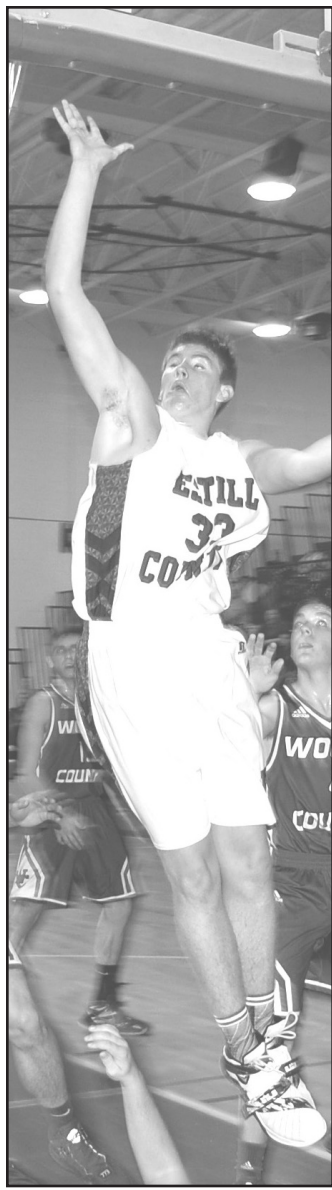

4-H Country Ham Project

In this project, youth ages 9-18 can cure up to two hams themselves and send one of them to the state fair to compete in the contest. This is a great opportunity to learn a new skill and have some delicious ham! Youth have the option of paying \$30 for one ham or \$60 for two hams. Certain criteria should be followed in order to complete the project. Youth must complete 6 hours of training under the supervision of a certified livestock volunteer. And, youth must give a 3-5 minute speech in January at the County Communications Contest as a practice run for the actual presentation at the Kentucky State Fair. More information and contracts can be obtained by contacting the Extension Office at 723-4557. Contracts need to be turned back into the Extension Office by December 11th.
