Grilling

Campers now days have become modern in every way..... and for some, roasting weenies on a stick just doesn't cut it anymore. Most grill owners like to pack their grills when heading to the campgrounds; I know we do and 80% of the campers I saw at Boonesborough during the 4th of July had gas grills. Outdoor enthusiasts are taking control of their menus by starting with equipment that can deliver a fireside four-star meal.

With camping season in full swing it's time for a refresher course to help keep you and your campsite in top shape.

Most people want to enjoy more than just hot dogs and burgers when they are grilling on the go. Having a portable grill gives you a lot more options for cooking than just about anything you can imagine.

Check out these tips for safe summer grilling:

*The Grill: When it comes to grilling and outdoor cooking, the debate over gas versus charcoal could rage all summer long. It's really a personal choice, but to me gas is more convenient and quicker, but charcoal is really ideal when you have time to kick back like on a camping trip, and tend to the flames.

*Fill'er Up: Make sure you bring enough propane or charcoal to keep the fires burning for your entire trip. On average, a 20 lb. propane tank will last for approximately 12-14 hours but you will need an adapter hose to attach to a portable gas grill. A

smaller, easy to tote 1 lb. tank will last for approximately for hour and a half, so make sure and pack accordingly. For charcoal grills you will need about 50 briquettes each time you grill.

*Safety First: Always make sure you are grilling on stable flat ground and are at least five away from anything flammable.

*Use Your Head: Make sure you extinguish your grill properly. Your grill should be cool to touch before you dispose spent charcoal ashes. Store your LP tank in the car in a secure upright position when not in use.

Stay Grounded, but Reach for the Stars: There's almost no limits on what you can grill outdoors. You could look for recipes that are more portable, have fewer ingredients and are easy to clean up for convenience. But also grillers that like to be challenged might try pizza, scallops, and even cake on the grill. With the right grill and preparation you can really do it all.

I like to grill kabobs, especially shrimp, beef and vegetables.

MARINATED BEEF KABOBS

- ¼ c. vegetable oil
- ½ t. salt
- 2 small zucchini, ½ inch pieces
- 2 T cider vinegar
- ¾ t. oregano (Or you may use your choice of veggies)
- 1 t. celery salt
- ½ t. black pepper
- 1 t. onion salt
- 1 boneless beef top round roast (About 2 lbs.), cut in 1 in. cubes
- ¾ t. garlic salt
- 6 medium mushroom caps

In small sauce pan combine oil, vinegar, all salts, oregano and pepper. Bring to boiling; remove from heat, let stand until cool. Place meat in a shallow pan or in a double zip lock bag. Add mushrooms and zucchini. Seal. And refrigerate for 4-6 hours turning occasionally. Alternately thread meat and vegetable on 6 skewers. Grill over hot coals or gas grill flame for 10-15 minutes or until desired doneness, basting often with marinade. Makes 6 servings.

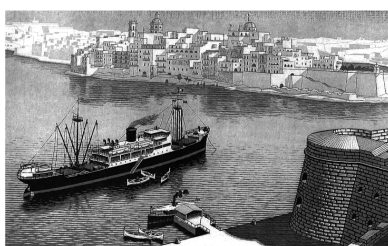
Germany became great but was reduced to rubble. Wrote a German philosopher, "They pushed God out of the universities and that was the beginning of the death sentence for the empire."

A Sense of Urgency

In the days of fasting in the wilderness of Judea, Jesus had been there for 40 days and had eaten nothing. So it was at a point of His weakness of the body that Satan made His assault upon Him. This episode is given in **Matthew 4** and **Luke 4**. Notice that the first thing that Satan used was to challenge His identity saying: "If thou be the Son of God," then turn these smooth, round stones into bread. Jesus gave Him this reply: "Saying: *It is written, that man shall not live by bread alone, but by every word of God.*"

Then a short time later the devil escorted Jesus up to a high mountain and gave him a vision of all the kingdoms of this world, and he did it in a moment of time saying: all this power will I give thee, and the glory of them, for that is delivered unto me, and to whomsoever I will give it. **Then he said:** there is just one hitch. They are yours if you will worship me, all shall be thine. **Matthew said:** *If thou fall down and worship me.* Our Lord's answer to him was: "Get thee behind me Satan for it is written: *Thou shalt worship the Lord thy God and him only shalt thou serve.*"

Then he made one more attempt to get Jesus to succumb to his suggestions. He took him to the highest place on the Jerusalem temple saying: "Jump off this place if thou be the Son of God." Satan knowing the scriptures repeated **Psalm 91:11**. He says angels will protect you. Go ahead and jump. They will catch thee in their arms and bear thee up lest you damage your feet during the landing.

Then our Lord answering said: "It is said, thou shalt not tempt the Lord thy God."

Now just an overview of this text will plainly show us all the tactics of the devil. He used the same approach on our Lord that he had previously used upon Adam and Eve in the garden. John wrote of these in his epistle **I John 2:15-16** saying: "Love not the world, neither the things that are in the world. If any man love the world, the love of the father is not in him. For all that is in the world, the lust of the flesh, and the lust of the eyes, and the pride of life is not of the father, but is of the world."

Dear reader, take notice that the devil has nothing to give you but earthly things. **Verses 17:** "And the world passeth away, and the lust thereof. But he that doeth the will of God abideth forever."

Notice that after Satan had used all his temptations, he departed. Do you know why? The answer is simply that he had nothing else to offer Him. This is also Satan's only offering to you today. He cannot offer eternal life, only our Lord can do that. **Romans 6:23** says: "for the wages of sin is death: but the gift of God is eternal life through Jesus Christ our Lord. So today, you will once again make your choice of whom you will listen unto. But Satan has nothing good to give you but eternal ruin.

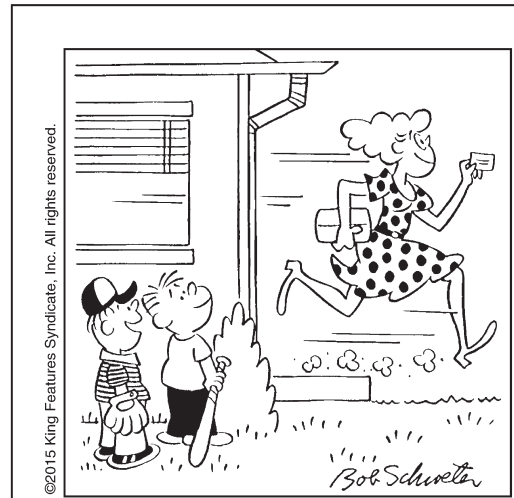
