It turned out that people did chew tobacco during most of the last century.





Shock and Awe? by BOB CASEY, preacher **Cornerstone Church of Christ Bond Street at Camp Avenue in West Irvine**

A few years ago our then president, George Bush used this phrase to describe the response that was being taken to show the Iraq nation that terror would be met by an even greater terror. I suppose that the night that this assault began that most, if not all, felt a great fear of shock and were awed at the bombing and noise, plus the fires that came as a result of this attack. And so it was a terrible time.

But I have written this as a reminder to all of us that an even greater time of shock and awe is coming upon the unsaved world. The Bible gives us a great detail of this forthcoming event. First, the stealth bombers that flew into Bagdad did so without being detected, but the coming again of our Saviour will supersede all prior events

that this world has ever seen all combined forever. Just think about the sudden sound from Heaven that will bring to a halt of all earth's activities. The voice of the arch-angel will issue a shout that will bring everyone to attention. Then the trumpet of God will sound (I Corinthians 15:52 and 1 Thessalonians 4:16) and before these men wrote, our Lord has much to say about this day in Matthew 24:29-31. Read these to see for yourselves. Here in Matthew's Gospel, it says that the sun will be darkened, even the stars shall begin to fall, because the powers of Heaven shall be shaken.

Then the clouds will begin to roll back as a scroll revealing the Saviour sitting upon his throne with all his holy angels around him. This will be the world's greatest event up to this time. Then we ask, "What will the unprepared do?" They will be a time of mourning, and lamenting, such as never before. **Revelation 1:7** describes this time. John writes in **Revelation 6:12-17** of this day with great accuracy. Men will be in a state of awareness that their day of salvation is gone forever. They will be a lot of praying taking place, but this is not for forgiveness and mercy, because they will know, "I did not take heed!" So they will flee to the places in the earth, praying for the mountains to bury them, simply because they will not be able to stand and be judged by the one they didn't obey. They know that their doom is sealed forever. We need to read passages like **Ephesians 6:13-14**, "Stand therefore, having our loins girt about with truth, and having on the breast plate of righteousness." But verse 13 also says, "Take unto you the whole armour of God, that ye may be able to withstand in the evil day, having done all to stand.''

Friends, this will be a terrible day for you if you have not prepared for it, but it does not have to be! Awaken, and arise and obey our Lord. He will forgive you, save you, and add you to his elect. Acts 2:36-47 guarantees it. If you fail, whose fault will it be?
